Saturday October the 21<sup>st</sup>

First part employed Bailing the wind  
very light but heavy sea on at one 30 pm  
saw a school of sperm whales going to the west  
saw 3 boats at 4 pm came on board with  
Success still Bailing the small whale the  
whale make a but 10 Whales Middle & Satter  
part strong gale & very rugged & heavy  
rain saw a sail so ended this day

Sunday October the 22<sup>nd</sup>

This day commenced with strong gale from  
S.W. & very rugged & rain at one 30 pm spoke  
licera at sunset the wind more moderate  
but still very rugged & rain Middle  
& Satter part more moderate licera  
still in sight so ended this day

Monday October the 23<sup>rd</sup>

This day commenced with moderate weather  
still cruising at sunset the weather about  
the same Middle part light weather at day  
light on bent for sail to repair the ship still  
steering up on the ocean & Steed ground so ended  
this day

Tuesday Oct the 24<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced with light weather still  
employed on the fore sail at 4 pm finished &  
went to the ship still with all sail out  
Middle & Satter part fine weather still

North Atlantic ocean Sailing for Sperm whales  
in the ocean Steed ground

Wednesday Oct the 25<sup>th</sup>

1871

First part of this day lulled to the weather wind  
saw black flock the weather very fine still cruising  
at 6 pm saw white water 5 miles off with  
sperm whales did not lowered the sun was down  
Middle & Satter part calm & very hazy saw Porpoise  
still employed on ship duty so ended this day

Sat. 40. 42 n

Long 46. 30 m

Thursday Oct the 26<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced with light wind but  
very cloudy at sunset the weather  
about the same Middle & Satter part strong  
wind & rain saw porpoises so ended this day  
no ab

Friday Oct the 27<sup>th</sup>

This day commenced with strong wind & very heavy  
rain from S.W. I saw finback at sun down the  
weather still the same at 9 in the evening spoke  
the Bark Ellen Snow of New Bedford at 10 and  
go aboard Middle & latter part strong winds  
& raining all time the Ellen Snow still in sight  
so ended this day no ab

Saturday Oct the 28<sup>th</sup>

First part of this day strong winds & raining  
still the wind from S.W. at 2 30 pm saw a other  
sails at sun down the wind more moderate  
still raining Middle & latter part more mod-  
erate still employed on ship duty met a sail  
so ended this day
