

Remarks on board Ship *Saint Edward*

Sunday March 2<sup>nd</sup> 1856

First part of these 24 hours  
strong breeze from the S<sup>W</sup>  
at 2 P.M. sighted a right  
whale and sail could see  
boats and shaved without  
success until past fresh breeze  
later part the same at 8 A.M.  
commenced boiling and so  
ends this 24 hours

Monday March 3<sup>rd</sup>

First part of these  
24 hours moderate breeze  
from S<sup>W</sup> sighted several  
finbacks midle wind hauled  
to the S later part strong  
breeze spoke the ship  
melting south of snowed  
with 10 whales this season

Tuesday March 4<sup>th</sup>

all these 24 hours light  
breeze and variable with  
rain and a heavy swell  
on at 8 P.M. fastened  
boiling the whale meat  
45 barrels midle and  
later part calm and light  
rain

Wednesday March 5<sup>th</sup> 1856

all this 24 hours light air  
and fog from S<sup>W</sup> ship  
working to the S sighted one  
right whale could see boats  
with cut success at sundown  
shortened sail for the night  
one sail sighted  
and so ends

Saturday 45.00  
Sunday 49.11

Thursday March 6<sup>th</sup> 1856

First part of these 24 hours  
fresh breeze from S<sup>W</sup>  
steaming to with fog squalls  
midle and later part thick  
and heavy weather and so ends

Friday March 7<sup>th</sup>

all of these 24 hours fresh  
breeze from S<sup>W</sup> heading to S  
with heavy weather sighted a  
number of finbacks and sulphur  
bottomed whales and so ends

Saturday March 8<sup>th</sup>

First part of these 24 hours  
strong winds from the S<sup>W</sup>  
steaming S at 5 P.M. sighted  
the Crosetts islands bearing  
distance 20 miles midle part  
thick fog later part the same  
employed in storing down  
and so ends
