Thursday 22nd

First part calm

from S.W. steering E

Latitude 51° 21' S
Longitude 71° 38' E

Friday March 23rd

First part breeze from S.W. strong
& under double reefed topsails
at 1 P.M. shortened sail for the night
middle part the wind hauled to the
S.E. made sail and heaved to the E

Latitude 50° 34' S
Longitude 73° 11' E

Saturday March 24th

First part of these 24 hours
oppressed with a fresh gale
from S.W. and heavy weather
shortened sail heaving to the E
middle and later part more
moderate

Latitude 49° 15' S
Longitude 75° 15' E
