

Remarks on board Ship James Edward

Sunday March 30th 1836

Latitude 49 26 S
 Long 74 00 E

all this 24 hours light
 breezes from E S E ship
 heaving to E and so ends

Monday March 31st

First part of these 24
 commenced with strong breezes
 from the N and blew with the
 ship heaving to the W at one
 A.M. the wind hauled to the
 W and commenced to blow a
 heavy gale later part more moderate

Latitude 48 11 S
 Longitude 71 34 E

Tuesday April 1st 1836

First part moderate breezes
 from the W heaving to S
 set the foresail and jib
 middle part the wind hauled
 to S W wore ship and heeled
 to W S W at 5 A.M. commenced
 to snow and rain from
 the S shortened sail and
 so ends no observation

Wednesday April 2nd

First part of these 24 hours
 a fresh gale from the W
 and blew wither middle
 part more moderate
 and blew later part the
 same and so ends

Latitude 48 52 S
 Longitude 75 00 E

Preamble to the Arctic expedition

Thursday April 3rd

Lat 47 39 S
 Long 75 45 E

First part of this 24
 came in with a fresh gale
 from the W ship heaving
 to the S middle part more
 moderate at 5 A.M. raised
 sail and steamed
 E S E

Friday April 4th

First part fresh breeze
 from S S W steering
 E S E middle and later
 part strong gale light
 rain and thick weather

Saturday April 5th

Latitude 46 15 S
 Long 79 30 E

First part of these
 24 hours commenced
 with a strong gale
 from S S W at 6 A.M.
 shortened sail and
 hove the ship to the wind
 heaving to E at daylight
 made all sail and heeled
 to the S E with pleasant
 weather
