

Remarks on board Ship James Edwards
bound to the Isle of France

of New Bedford

Sunday April 6th 1856

First part of this 24 hours
strong breeze from the N^W
shading & S. middle part
bore the ship to the wind
under close reefed topsails
at 5 A.M. Steered N^W and
so ends this 24 hours

Latitude 33.08
Longitude 71.20

Monday April 7th 1856

First part light winds
and heavy weather from
the N^W. Steaming S. Middle
part the same later part
calm with clear weather

Latitude 42.25 S
Longitude 80.26 E

Tuesday April 8th

all this 24 hours
light airs and calms
from the N^W and E.

Latitude 42.15 S
Longitude 80.26 E

Treasure H. Smith Master

Wednesday April 9th

all these 24 hours light
breezes from the S^W & N^W
steaming S^W & with light
rain and fog Capitan
Smith is taken down sick
with fever

Thursday 10th

these 24 hours fresh breeze
from S to E steaming
S^W by S^W and so ends

Latitude 40.20 S
Longitude 80.19 E

Friday April 11th

all these 24 hours light breezes
from S to E steaming S^W by S^W
for the Island of St. Paul

Latitude 39.27
Longitude 78.51

Saturday April 12

First light winds from
S^W steaming S^W by S^W at
4 P.M. sighted the island of
St. Paul bearing S^W
distance 40 miles thick
and later part light airs
from the N^W ship lying up
with thick and heavy weather
