first part strong winds from S.W. & course S.W. all sail set watches employed in ship's duty middle & later part fresh winds from N.W. course S.W. all sail set watches employed in repairing sails so ends

Sunday July 27th

commences fresh winds from N.W. & a large sail running from N.W. course S.W. all sail set watches employed in repairing sails at one part unlaid gills and bent a new one stored the old one away at 6 PM took in sail & have to get the ship at 4 AM made all sail set at 3 PM

Ship at the Island of Amsterdam

Monday July 28th

commences fresh winds from S.W. & course S.W. all sail set clear weather large sail running from S.W. at 6 PM hauled main course at 10 PM saw Island of Amsterdam bearing S.W. by 30 miles at 10 AM three boats in the land for whales and 5 white whales but could not strike at 4

Thursday July 29th

commences light air from S.W. standing up 4 on the land at 6 PM boats come on board middle part light air at 4 AM three boats went into the land for whales so ends light air

Ship Whaling at the Island of Amsterdam

Wednesday July 30th

commences light air from S.W. Part cloudy weather all hands employed in whaling at 7 PM boats come on board saw whales into the land but could not strike or get past middle & latter part light winds from N.W. cloudy weather at 1 PM sent three boats into the land all sail set working up 8 on the land

Thursday July 31st

commences fresh winds from N.W. all hands employed in whaling at 4 PM boats come on board at our boat got part but soon drew out and plenty of whales in to the land middle & latter part fresh winds at 6 AM 3 boats went into the land saw three ships steaming to Eastward so ends
