Remarks on board Friday

Jan 9th 1896

commenced light airs from ESE & cleared
all sail set course S.W. in clear weather
at 2 PM saw the Isle of France
bearing N.W. by W. 40 miles at
6 PM left off from middle part
light winds ESE at 11 AM
were ship heading off the land
with head sails aback at day light
were ship steered into the land
watches employed in ship's duty

variation 12 Deg. West by

Lat 20-00 20-10
Long 87-55

Remarks on board Saturday
Jan 10th

first part light airs from NE
clear weather all sail set steering
in part the land by the wind
at 4 PM the ship was one mile to
westward of the two small East-mountain
Islands heading in for the Soland with
at light house on middle & latter part
at 2 PM saw a back of shore
at day light were ship steered in to
the Harbor of Port Louis due of France

at 3 PM Capt Murray
gave orders to have a boat let down
to go along side of brig in
the harbor & the crew did not come
had out 35 fathoms chain

at 10 AM let go anchor in 7 fathoms water furled the sails
at 11 PM doctor came on board & Capt Murray went on shore

Remarks on board Sunday

at 1 PM arrived in steam ship

January 11th

first part by Civil Account brigs straddled from ESE
clear weather middle part winds from E clear weather
at 9 AM a boat came off from shore & at 3 PM Capt
Murray went on shore in the same shore boat
at 2 PM arrived one French party to anchor in the
harbor
