Tues Sept 8th

Begins with fresh Winds
from the Westward and pleasant Ship
steering to the Eastward Middle part
the same latter part the same

Wednes Sept 9th

Begins the same Ship
steering the same Watch employed in
Ship's Duties Middle part the same
latter part the same

Lat 40° 30' N
Long 43° 16' W

Thurs Sept 10th

Begins the same Ship
steering the same Middle part fresh
Winds latter part the same Watch
employed in Ship's Duties

Fri Sept 11th

Begins with fresh Winds
from the Eastward Ship steering by
the Wind to Southward at 4 P.M.
saw a Dead Whale to Windward at
day light took him along side and cut
him in and started the work

Sat Sept 12th

Begins with strong Winds
from N.E. and usually Watch employed
in Boiling Middle and latter part
more moderate and pleasant

Begins with fresh Winds
from S.E. and pleasant Ship steering
By the Wind under short Sail Boiling
Middle part the same latter part moderate

Mon. Sept 14th

Begins the same Ship
steering By the Wind under all Sail at
4 P.M. got through Boiling and washed
off Decks Middle part the same
latter part Wind from S.E. Ship
steering By the Wind to the Eastward

Begins the same Ship
steering the same at 8 P.M. light breeze
Middle part the same latter part the
same

Wednes Sept 16th

Begins with fresh Winds
and pleasant Ship S.E. under all Sail

steered S.E. & S. Broke out 537 Gals
of Water Dried Apples Sugar Meal &c

Begins the same Ship
steering the same under all Sail Middle
part light Air. latter part the same
Watch employed in Ship's Duties
