in cutting the whale at 6 P.M. got
him cut in and sat the watches Middle
part Wind and weather the same
 Latter part employed in Bailing

Mond Dec 7th

Begins with strong Winds
from the Westward and Rainy Middle
part the same Latter part the same
 Watch employed in Bailing

Tues Dec 8th

Begins with Moderate Gales
from the Westward and Pleasant Ship
saw two Bailing Middle part the
same Latter part more moderate
Ship cruising in the same Ground
under short Sail

Wednes Dec 9th

Begins the same Ship
working to S S & under short Sail at
4 P.M. saw two Wright Whales cleared
away the Brats and chased them with
no success at 6 P.M. came on Board and
took in Sail got through Bailing Middle
part the same Latter part the same

Begins the same all hands stowing
down at 5 P.M. got through stowing
Middle part good weather Latter part
the same Ship steering S & under all Sail

the same Middle part strong Winds and
pleasant Latter part the same

Lat 35° 30' S
Long 81° 36' E

Sund Dec 13th

Begins with fresh Winds
from the Westward and pleasant Ship
steering S & by S under all Sail Middle
part the same Latter part the same

Mond Dec 14th

Begins with strong Winds from
W and pleasant Ship steering S & by S Middle
part the same Latter part the same Watch
employed in repairing the fore top Sail
