Sues Apr 20<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light airs  
from S & Ship steering by the Wind  
to N & with pleasant weather at 5:00 PM  
Wind hauled to & tacked Ship and  
steered S. Middle and Latter parts  
the same at 10:00 AM saw a school of  
Sperm Whales chased away the Boats  
at 11:00 struck one to the Ward Boe

Wednes Apr 21<sup>st</sup>

Begins the same at  
10:00 AM took the Whale along side and  
got ready for cutting at 6:00 PM got  
the Whale in Ship laying under  
short sail with good weather Middle

at 10:00 AM started the Whaler

Thurs Apr 22<sup>nd</sup>

Begins with fresh  
Winds from E and pleasant Watch  
employed in Bailing Middle part  
Squally with rain Latter part  
strong Winds and pleasant ship  
working to Windward saw a Ship  
cutting Boats out 220 Sals of Water

Fri Apr 23<sup>rd</sup>

Begins the same Ship  
working to Eastward under Double  
Reef Top Sails Middle part the same  
Latter part strong Winds saw Ship James  
Donald cutting Her last Whale

Begins with strong Winds from  
N and pleasant Ship under Double Reef Top  
Sails working to Eastward at 10:00 PM got  
through Bailing and cleared up Decks  
Middle part Moderate Gale from E and pleasant  
Latter part the same

Sund Apr 25<sup>th</sup>

Begins the same Ship working  
to Windward under Double Reef Top Sails  
Middle part more moderate Latter part fresh  
Winds and pleasant Ship steering by the Wind

Mon Apr 26

Begins much the same at 10:00 PM  
Dashed Ship and stood to the Northward under  
all sail Middle part strong Winds and Cloudy  
at 10:00 AM Ship Latter part the same  
Ship under Top Sails and Courses

Long 178.45 E

Tues Apr 27<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong Winds  
from E-N & Ship steering by  
the Wind to Southward at 6:00 PM Wore Ship  
and stood to the Northward Middle part  
the same Latter part strong Winds

Lat 31.58 S

Long 178.03 E

Wednes Apr 28<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong Winds  
from N & Ship steering by the Wind on  
opposite Tacks Boats out 543 Sals of Water  
Middle part took in sail at day light began  
to steer down the Oil weather moderate
