Tues Dec 28th

Begins with fresh Winds from S Ship steering to the Westward under all Sail spoke Ship Europa Broke out Water Middle part the same Latter part the same

Lat 35^o 10' S

Long 156^o 00' E

Wednes Dec 29th

Begins the same Ship cruising on the same ground saw nothing that looked like a Whale Middle and Latter part the same

Thurs Dec 30th

Begins with light Airs and Calms Ship going round and round Middle part Calm Latter part light Airs from the Southward Ship steering by the Wind to the Eastward

Lat 35^o 52' S

Long 156^o 30' E

Fry Dec 31st

Begins with Calm and clear weather Ship laying still Watch employed in repairing old Sails &c Middle part the same Latter part the same so ends this day & Year

Sat Jan 1st

Begins with Calm and clear weather Ship cruising on the same ground Middle and Latter parts the same

Sund Jan 2nd

Begins with light Airs from S W and pleasant Ship steering to N of Middle part took in Fall Latter part steered the same spoke Bark Henry Fisher of Sydney

Long 155^o 57' E

Mon Jan 3rd

Begins the same Ship steering the same saw a number of English Whale Ships Middle and Latter parts the same

Tues Wednes Jan 4th

Begins with pleasant weather Ship working to N W saw nothing Middle part the same Latter part Cloudy and light Airs

Lat 35^o 40' S

Wednes Jan 5th

Begins with light Airs from the Westward Ship working to the Eastward under all Sail Watch employed in repairing the old Sails Middle and Latter part the same

Lat 35^o 52' S

Long 159^o 00' E

Thurs Jan 6th

Begins with strong Winds from N W and Cloudy with Squalls ship laying to at 11 O' kept off to N Middle and latter parts the same
