Tues June 6th

Begins with fresh winds from N^W and Cloudy Ship working to Northward on opposite tacks Middle and Latter parts the same

Wednes June 7th

Begins the same Ship working the same under Double Reef Top Sails Middle part the same Latter part Wind from N and Rain

Thurs June 8th

Begins the same Ship still working to windward Middle part heavy rain and light winds Latter part the same

Lat 29° 00' S

Long 176° 00' W

Fri June 9th

Begins with strong winds from N and Cloudy Ship working to the Eastward under all present sail Middle and Latter parts the same

Sat June 10th

Begins the same Ship working to Eastward Middle and Latter parts the same saw Bark Cleome

Lat 28° 30' S

Sund June 11th

Long 178° 00' W

Begins with pleasant weather Ship working to Eastward under Top Sails and courses with wind from the Northward Middle and Latter parts the same

Lat 28° 00' S

Long 179° 50' W

Mon June 12th

Begins with strong winds from the North and rugged Ship steering by the Wind to the Eastward Middle and Latter part the same

Tues June 13th

Begins the same ship steering the same under all sail Middle and Latter parts the same

Lat 29° 50' S

Long 176° 00' W

Wednes June 14th

Begins with light airs from S & Ship steering N by W under all sail Middle and Latter parts the same Water employed in repairing old sail

Lat 27° 00' S

Long 175° 50' W

Thurs June 15th

Begins with light Airs from S and pleasant Ship steering N by W Middle and Latter parts the same spoke Bark Minerva

Lat 26° 30' S

Long 175° 30' W

Fri June 16th

Begins the same Ship steering N by W under all sail Middle and Latter parts the same

Sat June 17th

Begins with light Airs from S & Ship steering N by W Middle part the same Latter part wind the same saw a School of sperm Whales going to Westward chased away the Boats and chased them at dark Waist Boat struck and got on at 9th evening took him along side
