Mon Oct 9th

Begins with good weather
Boats all off saw very few Whales got none

Tues Oct 10th

Begins the same Boats cruising
the same saw two Whales got none

Wed Oct 11th

Begins the same two Boats
sailed in Board getting Ship ready for
Sea saw very few Whales

Thurs Oct 12th

Begins with good weather
Boats off cruising saw the Whales got
none

Fri Oct 13th

Begins the same Boats off
got one Whale and took him to the
Kapehen Struck and lost another

Sat Oct 14th

Begins the same two Boats
from each Ship off cruising struck
and sank a Whale and lost him
the Live Oak lost a Boat by the same
Whale

Sund Oct 15th

Begins the same Boats
all on Board

Mon Oct 16th

Begins with strong
winds Boats all Board settling up with
the other Ships

Tues Oct 17th

Begins with strong Winds from
N.E. and squally Ship ready for Sea

Wed Oct 18th

Begins the same at day light
called all hands and hove up Anchor
and steered out of the Bay at 10 AM
got clear of the land and steered by
the Wind to the southward

Lat 21° 05' S

Long 175° 14' W

Thurs Oct 19th

Begins the same Ship steering
the same under all present sail stored
the chains and Anchors and hoisted new
Iron Lines through out Middle part stored
S. Latter part stored S. S. S.

Lat 23° 15' S

Long 175° 14' W

Fri Oct 20th

Begins with strong Winds from
N.E. Ship steering S under all sail
Middle and Latter parts the same

Lat 26° 15' S

Long 176° 15' W

Sat Oct 21st

Begins with fresh Winds from
S. Ship steering S Watch employed in setting
up Shocks Middle and Latter parts
the same

Sund Oct 22nd

Begins with fresh Winds
from S. Ship steering by the Wind to
the southward Middle and Latter
parts rain
