Wednes Jan 17th

Begins with good weather at day light called all hands and backed in to the Whale Middle part the same. Latter part the same at 4 P.M. had the Whale in and Case Railed

Thurs Jan 18th

Begins the same at day light started the Works and cut the Spink Middle and Latter parts empty in Boiling
Lat 43° 00' S
Long 114° 30' W

Fry Jan 19th

Begins the same Ship cruising on the same ground Boiling Middle and Latter parts the same

Sat Jan 20th

Begins the same at noon got through Boiling and chased up Middle and Latter parts the same

Sund Jan 21st

Begins the same Ship cruising the same ground nothing in sight Middle and Latter parts the same

Mon Jan 22nd

Begins with good weather Ship under short Sail steering down at dark got through steering and chased up decks.

Begins with good weather Ship cruising under all Sail with nothing in sight Middle and Latter part strong Winds from S W

Wednes Jan 24th

Begins the same Ship cruising the same saw like fish did not lower the Boats Middle and Latter part calm

Long 113° 50' W

Thurs Jan 25th

Begins with good weather Ship working to Westward under all Sail spoke Bark Louisa with 5 Whales had lost three Heads Middle and Latter part light breeze

Lat 42° 45' S
Long 114° 20' W

Fry Jan 26th

Begins with good weather Ship cruising Bark Louisa in sight nothing of the Whale kind seen

Sat Jan 27th

Begins with Moderate Gales from S W Ship laying two under Close Reef Main top Sail Middle and Latter parts the same

Sund Jan 28th

Begins the same Ship laying the same Bark Louisa in sight Middle and Latter parts the same

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
