Begins with fresh Winds from N by E and cloudy ship steering N by E under all sail Boreas to Barbadoes Middle part the same Latter part the same

Begins with fresh Trades and squally ship steering N by E Middle and Latter parts the same

Fri May 3rd

Begins with fresh Winds from N by E and pleasant ship steering N by E under all sail Middle and Latter parts the same

Lat 6th 48 N
Long 44th 15 W

Sat May 4th

Begins with strong Winds and pleasant ship steering N by E and N by E Middle part the same Latter part the same at 11 AM we spoke a French Man-of-War and got three Pecks of Irish Potatoes and 10 Bottles of Spine Juice at 12 AM kept off for Barbadoes under all sail

Begins with strong Winds from N by E ship steering N by E under all sail Middle part squally Latter part the same

Begins with strong Winds from N by E ship steering N by E under all sail Middle part the same Latter part the same

Tues May 7th

Begins with fresh Winds from N by E ship steering N by E under all sail Middle and Latter parts the same

Wednes May 8th

Begins much the same ship steering the same under all sail Middle part rain squally Latter part pleasant

Thurs May 9th

Begins the same ship steering N by E Middle and Latter parts the same

Fri May 10th

Begins with fresh Winds from N by E ship steering N by E under all sail Middle part the same Latter part the same at 4 PM we saw the Island of Barbadoes bearing N by E Dist 30 Miles

Sat May 11th

Begins the same ship steering for the Island at 4 PM came to anchor in the Road Street in 15 Fathoms Water Middle part good weather Latter part the same sent the Watch ashore on Liberty the other Watch Painter ship inside at Sun at 6 Watch came on Board
