

Remarks On Board Ship Janus of New Bedford, Mass.

Doable seized the topsails
Middle part the same. Latter part fresh breeze from
E. N.E. heading S.E. by E. the wind glazy. set whale topsails
Satt 39.20 N. Long 65.08 W.

Remarks Sunday July 20th.

Fresh breeze from E. N.E. heading S.E. by E. at 1 Pm tacked
and headed North. started one pipe of fresh water some mizzen
topsail bovelins. finished the main top gallant yard sent it aloft & bent the sail.
Middle part light breeze and calm's heading S.E. by E.
Latter part light breeze from the Southward heading Eastward fine weather.
Satt 40.00 N. Long 64.20 W.

Remarks Monday July 21st.

Fresh breeze from South steering E. N.E. and E. by N. saw a
spout three times but saw no more of it. saw a merchantman steering Westward
Middle part light breeze the wind baffling Eastward heading E. N.E.
Latter part stiff breeze from the East heading N.E. by N. having rainy
weather. the wind increasing double reefed the topsails saw a can boy painted red.

Remarks Tuesday July 22nd.

Strong breeze from the East baffling North with changeable
weather heading N. N.E. and North had considerable rain. took
in the mainsail, hoisted the Larboard boats on the upper cranes
and set main spencer and spanker. at 6 Pm took in gill
and spanker. at 8 Pm wore round and headed to the S.E.
Middle part A moderate gale from the N.E.
heading E. S.E. took in fore and mizzen topsails
Latter part the same. saw a schooner steering to the S.W. opened one cask of bread.

Remarks Wednesday July 23rd.

A moderate gale from the N.E. baffling heading E. S.E. and S.E.
had some drizzling rain set the gill and fore and mizzen topsails.
Middle part strong breeze from the N.E. baffling
Eastward at 2 Am wore round and headed N. N.E.
Latter part strong breezes with glaze from East heading N. N.E.
set fore and main topsails whole. at 11 Am double reefed the
fore topsail. employed in ship's duty.
Satt by Oh 41.30 N. Long 61.38 W.

Remarks Thursday July 24th.

Strong breeze from the East baffling heading N. N.E. and N.E. by N. under
doable reefed topsails, courses, gill and spanker, saw two sails.
Middle part changeable. the wind veered to E. S.E. heading N.E. by E.
Latter part stiff breeze from the S.E. heading N.E. by E. saw two
sails steering Westward. employed in ship's duty.
Satt 42.37 N. Long 61.14 W.

Remarks Friday July 25th.

Stiff breeze from the S.E. heading N.E. by E. saw grompuses and
one sail. at 7 Pm tacked to the Southward.
Middle part fresh and light breeze from E. S.E. heading South.
Latter part strong breeze from E. S.E. heading South had considerable
rain. the weather changeable at daylight double reefed the fore
topsail. at 9 Am doable reefed the main topsail. The wind glazy
at 11 Am it broke away the wind veering Southward
Satt 42.00 N. Long 60.41 W.

Remarks Saturday July 26th.

Fresh and light breezes from the South and S. S.W. at about 1 Pm wore
round and steered E. by S. saw 3 or 4 merchantmen steering Westward signal
ized one an English double topped ship. at 5.30 Pm lowered the boats for practice.
Middle part light breeze from South steering E. by S.
Latter part light breeze from South with fog, rain and calm's
steering E. by S. at 11 Am the wind baffling Eastward with plenty rain
and fog heading North. saw 2 or 3 merchantmen bound Westward
at 11.30 Am tacked and headed South.

Remarks Sunday July 27th.

Light breeze from the East baffling North with fog and rain
had light air and calm's. at 1 Pm light breeze from the North
steering E. by S. saw two merchantmen bound West. had some fog.
Middle part the wind veered to W. N.W. with a light breeze
and fog weather steering E. by S.
Latter part light breeze from West with fog weather sometimes
quite clear than fog again steering E. by S. having very
changeable weather and all sorts but not much good
as it is such that we do not have a chance to look for whales
Satt 42.30 N. Long 59.37 W.
