

Remarks On Board Ship Janus Of New Bedford

Remarks Monday July 28th.

Sight breeze from the West and calm steering E by S with foggy and clear weather. at 4 Pm the wind veered to South with a light breeze steering E by S. at 5.30 Pm thick fog.

Middle part the wind veered to SW with a fresh breeze the wind increasing steering E by S. at 3 Am took in some sail.

Satter part strong breeze from the West steering E by S. with foggy weather and a rugged sea running, took in mainsail and set the main top gallant sail.

Lat 42.30 N. Long 54.40 W.

Remarks Tuesday July 29th.

Strong breeze from the W. NW. with quite clear weather steering E. S. E. at 6.30 Pm saw Blackfish.

Middle part light breeze from W. NW. steering E. S. E.

Satter part light breeze from W. NW. steering E. S. E. employed breaking out for Sugar, Coffee, Rice, Peas, Dried Apples, Flour, and Codfish, started one hll of Beef and one hll of Pork. saw a Merchantman steering Westward.

Remarks Wednesday July 30th.

Light breeze from the W. NW. steering E. S. E. saw a white water once saw no more of it. at 3 Pm came in thick fog and light air from the Westward. at 4 Pm employed lashing some of the spare spars.

Middle part light air and calm with a thick fog heading E. S. E. saw Blackfish during the night.

Satter part light air and calm with a thick fog started two cask of water employed lashing the cutting pendant shackles to the mainmast head, and putting battens on the new yards.

Remarks Thursday July 31st.

Light air and calm employed in small yards at 4 Pm employed lashing the anchors in a thick fog. at 6.30 Pm light air from the S. E. at 7 Pm tacked to the Southward.

Middle part light air from E. S. E. heading S by E.

Satter part light breeze from E. S. E. heading South saw a Brig heading to the S. E. quite clear weather employed lashing a spare topmast, and other small yards.

Remarks Friday August 1st.

Sight breeze from E. S. E. baffling Southward, at 4 Pm tacked and headed E by N. exchanged signals with an English Ship steering about E. N. E.

Middle part light breeze from E. S. E. heading Eastward Satter part fresh breeze from the South heading E. S. E. saw blunt nose grampuses, saw spouts two or three times but saw no more of them, employed in ship's duty, saw one sail heading Eastward.

Lat 42.58 N. Long 48.55 W.

Remarks Saturday August 2nd.

Fresh breeze from the South steering N. E. and E. S. E. saw three sails merchantman the weather smoky and hazy, at 6 Pm had a few drops of rain.

Middle part light breeze from S. SW. steering E. S. E. had some rain Satter part light breeze from the W. NW. steering E. S. E. with foggy weather saw one sail heading Eastward. had some light rain.

Remarks Sunday August 3rd.

Sight breeze from the W. NW. with fog steering E. S. E.

Middle part light breeze from the W. NW. steering E. S. E. foggy weather. Satter part light breeze from the W. NW. steering E. S. E. foggy in the morning at 9 Am saw one sail working to the Westward.

Remarks Monday August 4th.

Sight breeze from the W. NW. steering E. S. E. at 12.30 Pm boarded the Bark Elizabeth of Bristol England 28 days from Cardiff bound to New York loaded with coal, put letters on board of her gave home direct, saw a grampus, had a light shower of rain.

Middle part light breeze from W. NW. baffling South steering E. S. E. Satter part stiff breeze from the SW. steering E. S. E. had some fog and light rain in the morning at 8 Am took in flying jib, fore and mizzen top gallant sails, saw a ginsack one sail in sight heading Westward.

Lat 43.47 N. Long 47.11 W.

Remarks Tuesday August 5th.

Strong breeze from the SW. steering E. S. E. saw one ship steering Westward at 6 Pm had some light rain at 2 Pm double reefed the topsails and furled the mainsail, at 4 Pm took in main top gallant sail.

Middle part fresh breeze from the SW. steering E. S. E. had some fog and light rain.
