

Remarks On Board Ship Janus Of New Bedford. Mass.

Latter part light breeze from the SW steering S. S. E. made some sail, had fog and light rain, sometimes quite clear weather.

Remarks Wednesday August 6th.

Light air and calm, employed in ship's duty saw a grampus at 6 Pm lowered two boats to practice the green hands.

Middle part light air and calm.

Latter part light breeze from the SW heading S. S. E. saw porpoises employed breaking out for lumber.

Lat 43.32 N. Long 37.33 W.

Remarks Thursday August 7th.

Light breeze from the S. S. E. heading Eastward saw a hermaphrodite big heading to the SW at 6 Pm saw white water, were round headed to the SW.

Middle part light breeze from S. S. E. heading to the SW had considerable rain.

Latter part stiff breeze from the S. S. W. heading to the S. E. employed breaking out for water, had some light drizzling rain.

Lat 42.54 N. Long 37.02 W.

Remarks Friday August 8th.

Fresh and strong breeze from the S. S. W. heading to the S. E. had some drizzling rain with one or two squalls, saw a grampus breaching at sunset the ship under double reefed topsails, jib and foresail &c.

Middle part fresh breeze from the West, heading S. S. W.

Latter part fresh breeze from the Westward steering S. by W. set all sail, at 11 Am saw a Schooner heading to the SW.

Lat 42.34 N. Long 35.56 W.

Remarks Saturday August 9th.

Fresh breeze from Westward steering East at 3 Pm steering South, exchanged signal with an American merchant Schooner, one bark in sight overhauled Westward.

Middle part heading to the South.

Latter part fresh breeze from the SW with smoky and hazy weather steering E. S. E. employed in ship's duty.

Lat 41.45 N. Long 33.00 W.

Remarks Sunday August 10th.

Strong breeze from the SW smoky and hazy steering to the S. E. saw grampus breaching took in some sail, at 5 Pm saw one sail, at sunset the ship under double reefed main topsail close reefed mizzen topsail, St. J. Staysail, foresail

and main spencer, George Barton was behind after being called twice and very insolent while set to work loosing and furling the mizzen top gallant sail at sunset when he came down I asked him if he meant his insolence to me, he said he did, for which, I struck him on the cheek when he caught hold of my arms, but he soon let go of them.

Middle part strong smoky SW wind heading S. by E.

Latter part strong wind from the SW heading S. by E. smoky and hazy at daylight set double reefed fore topsail and jib. saw grampus breaching at 11 Am took in the jib.

Lat 41.09 N. Long 31.50 W.

Remarks Monday August 11th.

Strong wind from the SW and W. S. W. heading Southward with a rugged sea running saw one sail steering Eastward at 4.30 Pm were round and headed to the SW.

Middle part strong wind from W. S. W. heading SW had some rain.

Latter part strong wind from W. S. W. heading SW at 10 Am had a squall from the Westward with wind and rain, clewed up the fore and mizzen topsails and clewed down the main topsail at 11 Am set the topsails as they were reefed.

Lat 41.16 N. Long 32.21 W.

Remarks Tuesday August 12th.

Strong wind from the SW with squalls heading W. S. W. under double reefed topsails, foresail and stem sails, had some rain, saw porpoises.

Middle part strong wind from the SW heading W. S. W.

Latter part wind the same saw two sails steering Eastward set the jib.

Lat 41.26 N. Long 33.42 W.

Remarks Wednesday August 13th.

Strong wind from the SW heading W. S. W. smoky weather saw a grampus started one bbl of beef and one bbl of pork.

Middle part strong wind from S. S. W. heading West.

Latter part wind the same heading West set the mainsail at 10 Am took in the jib at 12 Pm took in the mainsail, employed in ship's duty.

Lat 41.33 N.

Remarks Thursday August 14th.

A moderate gale from the S. S. W. heading West with a heavy sea on, at 3 Pm took in sail to a close reefed main topsail and stem sails had some rain with squalls, at sunset more moderate.

Middle part the wind veered to the Westward heading S. S. W.
