

Remarks On Board Ship Janus of New Bedford Mass.

Remarks Thursday September 23th.

Strong breeze from the NW with squalls standing off and on at Santa Cruz Flores, received on board 63 bbls Potatoes & basket of Onions, 1 basket of Eggs, 1 basket of Apples and 18 Pumpkins, sent ashore two barrels of Black fish oil gazing 29 $\frac{1}{2}$ and 30 gallons each 5 boxes of soap and 2 bags of bread at 4 Pm nearly calm, at sunset the captain came on board and steered Southward set all sail, at dusk steering SSW, two Portuguese, Middle part squally with strong breeze from the NW steering SSW, latter part strong breeze from the NW steering SSW, had a few squalls, in the morning saw a merchant bark steering Eastward, started three casks of fresh water into the bath and stowed the cable below again.

Sat 31.25 N.

Long 31.08 W.

Remarks Friday September 26th.

Strong breeze from the NW steering SSW, employed overhauling lumber, at 4.30 Pm saw one sail heading to the Westward.

Middle part the same.

Satter part strong breeze from the NW strong in the morning and baggling Westward steering SSW, at 10 Am light breeze from the Westward for a few minutes, saw a white water and a piece of squid had a few light squalls with little rain.

Sat 34.39 N.

Long 30.35 W.

Remarks Saturday September 27th.

Light breeze from the Northward steering SSW, employed heaving out for sleep, started one bbl of Beef and one bbl of Pork.

Middle part light breeze from the NW steering SSW.

Satter part the same, saw porpoises.

Sat 32.50 N.

Long 30.29 W.

Remarks Sunday September 28th.

Light breeze from the Westward baggling heading SSW and SSW, saw the lower part of a vessel lower mast also saw 2 or 3 hump backs.

Middle part strong breeze from the West steering SSW.

Satter part in the morning squally with rain the wind baggling to the SW, at 7 Am fresh breeze from the West steering SSW.

Sat 30.30 N.

Long 29.53 W.

Remarks Monday September 29th.

Fresh breeze from the West steering SSW.

Middle part the same.

Satter part in the

morning rainy with a light breeze from the West steering SSW.

Sat 28.45 N.

Long 29.36 W.

Remarks Tuesday September 30th.

Light breeze from the Northward steering SSW, at 1 Pm saw a sperm whale going to the SW quite moderate lowered for him struck him with the first iron but soon drew from him, the whale went to leeward the boat in chase when another whale came up with the one that had been struck and a boat went on and fastened the other boat soon got fast and we saved him at 5.30 Pm took him alongside the ship Janus, and shortened sail.

Middle part fresh breeze from Eastward put up the cutting gear, &c.

Satter part stiff breeze from the Eastward at daylight were round then hooked on to the whale and began to cut him in got the head off and jam mast in when the gluke chain parted.

Remarks Wednesday October 1st.

Strong breeze from the Eastward heading Southward finished the body.

Middle part strong breeze from the Eastward heading to the SE, employed clearing away the jaw cutting up blubber and boiling, Satter part stiff breeze from the Eastward heading to the SE, employed boiling and cutting in the flunk.

Remarks Thursday October 2nd.

Stiff breeze from the Eastward heading to the SE, employed boiling body and boiling the case overboard.

Middle part fresh breeze from the Eastward heading to the SE, with the case hanging in the tackle alongside, boiling, Satter part fresh breeze from the Eastward at 8 Am case round and headed to the SE, finished cutting flunk off of the case and let it go.

Sat 27.58 N.

Long 30.48 W.

Remarks Friday October 3rd.

Light breeze from the ESE heading to the SE, finished boiling the body and commenced boiling the head.

Middle part light breeze from the SE heading ESE, had two showers of rain about 11 Pm, employed boiling.

Satter part light breeze from the SE heading ESE, employed cutting up flunk and boiling.

Sat 28.20 N.

Long 30.58 W.
