Sight breeze from the S.E. steering S.W. had some light rain, saw several sails.

Middle part light breeze from the Eastward steering S.W.

Satter part fresh breeze from the Eastward steering S.W. saw one sail heading Southward, employed making spun yarn and a harness cable.

Remarks Thursday October 16th.

Squally weather from the Eastward with wind and rain cleared down the light sails at 2 P.M. cleared away steering S.W. at sunset had another squall saw another sail.

Middle part squally had a light breeze from the S.E. heading S.W. and S.W. by S.

Satter part squally and rainy weather heading Southward at 11 P.M. nearly calm, saw one sail.

Remarks Friday October 17th.

light air and calm at 4 P.M. light air from the S.W. heading to the S.E.

Middle part light air baffling the ship working Southward.

Satter part in the morning had some light rain 2 or 3 sails in sight at 8 A.M.

light breeze from the Northward baffling steering S.W. by W.

No Observations

Remarks Saturday October 18th.

Sight breeze from the Northward baffling Eastward, at 2 P.M. had considerable rain with a light breeze from the Eastward steering S.W. by W.

Middle part baffling wind with squalls of wind and rain.

Satter part light air from the S.W. saw porpoises. Three sails in sight at 10 P.M. nearly calm, at 11.30 P.M. had a squall with wind and rain from Eastward steering S.W. by W.

No Observations

Remarks Sunday October 19th.

Sight baffling breeze and rainy weather the ship working Southward, a merchant bark in sight about 4 or 5 miles off working Southward.

Middle part baffling wind from S.W. to S.E. the

ship on both tacks during the night.

Satter part light breeze from the Southward baffling had some rain.

The ship working Southward four sails in sight three of them bound South exchanged signals with one on American ship.

Remarks Monday October 20th.

Fresh breeze from the South baffling heading S.W. and S.W. by W.

Captain Joseph H. Cornell A.D. 1862.

Three sails in sight bound South at sunset exchanged signals with the same American ship have been sailing together only about one mile apart for the last two hours she was about one mile to windward of us.

Middle part light breeze from the Southward heading S.W. by S. W.

Satter part fresh breeze from S.E. heading S.W. saw several sails bound North and South, saw gunper's.

Lat 3.25 N.

Long 26.10 W.

Remarks Tuesday October 21st.

Fresh breeze from the S.E. heading S.W. at 2 P.M. had a squall of rain.

Middle part fresh breeze from S.E. heading S.W. all sail set.

Satter part strong breeze from S.E. heading S.W. had two showers of rain, wind blew took in fore and mizzen top gallant sails but soon set them again, employed breaking out provision found a barrel of pickles nearly all spoiled, opened a cask of meal, started one lb of beef and one lb of pork, saw sail.

Remarks Wednesday October 22nd.

Fresh breeze from the S.E. little baffling South heading to the S.W.

Middle part fresh breeze from S.E. heading S.W.

Satter part strong breeze from the S.E. steering S.W. had a few squalls of wind and light rain, took in mizzen fore and mizzen top gallant sails.

Lat 00.48 South.

Long 29.46 West.

Remarks Thursday October 23rd.

Fresh breeze from the S.E. steering S.W. at 4 P.M. steering S.W. by S.

Middle part fresh breeze from the S.E. steering S.W. by S.

Satter part strong breeze from the S.E. steering S.W. by S. had a squall in the morning at 6.30 A.M. took in fore and mizzen top gallant sails the wind freshening, saw one sail to windward heading to the S.W.

Lat 3.20 South

Remarks Friday October 24th.

Strong breeze from the S.E. steering S.W. by S.

Middle part strong breeze from the S.E. steering S.W. by S.

Satter part strong breeze from the S.E. with squalls but not much rain steering S.W. employed picking over potatoes.

Long 33.10 W.

Remarks Saturday October 25th.

Fresh breeze from the S.E. steering S.W. by S. at 5 P.M. saw one sail.

Middle part light breeze from the S.E. steering to the S.W.
