Fresh breeze from the North had some rain steering South. smoky haze.

Middle part fresh breeze from the North steering South rainy weather.

Satter part light breeze from the North steering South had some light rain. at noon calm and cloudy weather.

Remarks Wednesday November 5th.

Sight air and calm. Two sails in sight.

Middle part light breeze from the S.E. heading S.W. had some rain.

Satter part light breeze from the S.E. steering South the weather thick and hazy at noon fog with light drizzling rain and all sail set.

Remarks Thursday November 6th.

Fresh breeze from the S.E. steering South at 4 Pm thick weather with heavy rain. at sunset no rain steering South all sail set.

Middle part fresh breeze from the East steering South had rain.

Satter part light breeze from the North steering South employed breaking at the after hatchway for butter and ham, opened a small cask of beef filled up two bl with it, and put what was left in the harness cask, saw one sail in the morning.

Remarks Friday November 7th.

Fresh breeze from the S.W. steering South at 4 Pm steering S.E. cloudy weather with fine rain drizzling, at sunset all sail set.

Middle part fresh breeze from the North steering S.E. had some rain.

Satter part fresh breeze from the S.W. steering S.E. had plenty of rain, at noon the wind veered to the N.W. and cleared away some.

Remarks Saturday November 8th.

Fresh breeze from the N.W. steering S.E. having foggy drizzling rain, and thick weather and cloudy, at 5 Pm fresh breeze from the Westward steering S.E. at sunset set the flying jib.

Middle part fresh breeze from the Westward luffing to the South, heading to the S.E.

Satter part strong breeze from the S.E. heading Eastward had some rain and foggy squalls, at 6 Am took in fore and stung top gallant sails.

Remarks Sunday November 9th.

Fresh breeze from the S.E. heading Eastward at 8 Pm. tacked and headed to the S.W.

Middle part light breeze from the S.E. heading S.W.

Satter part light breeze from the S.E. heading S.W. with considerable swell on from the Southward. Saw porpoises.

Lat 30.44 S.

Long 33.21 W.

Remarks Monday November 10th.

Fresh breeze from the S.E. veering Eastward heading to the Southward at sunset with a strong breeze from East heading S.E. with all sail set.

Middle part strong wind from the East heading S.E. at 9 Pm double reefed the topsails, diked mainmast and flew the wind increasing, had some rain.

Satter part A moderate gale from the S.E. heading South had some drizzling rain and thick weather, the ship under double reefed fore and main topsail, and foresail &c.

Remarks Tuesday November 11th.

First part A strong gale from the S.E. the ship heading to the S.W. took in the fore topsail, foresail and close reefed the main topsail, set the fore Spencer.

Middle part the gale moderated at 1 Pm wore round the wind from S.E. heading East, set double reefed topsails and foresail.

Satter part light breeze from the S.E. heading Eastward a heavy swell on at all sail in the morning saw porpoises put fresh capping on the end of main rigging.

Remarks Wednesday November 12th.

Sight air from the Southward heading to the S.E. saw grampuses.

Middle part light breeze from the S.W. steering S.E.

Satter part light air from the Westward with calm steering S.E. unbent the main topsail to repair it.

Lat 33.03 S.

Long 32.30 W.

Remarks Thursday November 13th.

Sight air from the S.W. steering S.E. finished repairing the main topsail and bent it again.

Middle part light breeze from the S.W. steering S.E.

Satter part light breeze from the S.W. steering S.E. all sail set.
