Strong breeze from the N.W. steering S.E. and E.S.E. smoky and hazy, saw a large quantity of finbacks, finished repairing the foresail and bent it again, at sunset steering E.S.E. with all sail set water green.

Middle part strong breeze from the N.W. steering E.S.E.

Satter part strong breeze from the North steering E.S.E. had some rain in the morning smoky weather saw some finbacks.

Remarks Sunday November 16th.

Fresh breeze from the N.E. baffling Southward steering E.S.E. at sunset light breeze from the South heading E.S.E.

Middle part light breeze from the S.E. heading E.S.E. and E.S.E.

Satter part light air baffling in the calm heading to the N.E. smoky weather, at 11 Am light air from the Westward steering E.S.E. saw a few finbacks.

Remarks Monday November 17th.

Light air from the Westward steering E.S.E. at 2 Pm light breeze from the Westward with a swell the ship steering E.S.E. saw finbacks.

Middle part light breeze from the Westward steering E.S.E.

Satter part fresh breeze from the N.W. steering E.S.E. saw finbacks and one sail in sight, at 10 Am spoke the Louisa of New Bedford Captain Steen 16 months out with 350 bl of sperm oil, and 200 bl of whale oil.

Remarks Tuesday November 18th.

Fresh breeze from the N.W. heading N.E. gaming with the bark Louisa, at sunset shortened sail, got two pigs from her, let her homelands.

Middle part fresh breeze from the N.W. heading to the N.E. Satter part strong breeze from the N.W. at daylight made sail and steered East, saw a finback. The bark Louisa in sight in the morning.

Remarks Wednesday November 19th.

Strong breeze from the N.W. steering E.S.E. at sunset had a little rain.

Middle part strong wind from the N.W. steering E.S.E. at 3 Am double reefed the topsail, furlled gill, mainsail and mizzen topsail.

Satter part a gale of wind from the N.W. at 6 Am furlled the fore topsail and foresail, then brought the ship to the wind on the larboard tack heading N.N.E. at 8 Am close reefed the main topsail, at noon set the fore staysail.

Remarks Thursday November 20th.

Blowing a gale from the N.W. heading to the N.E. considerable rain at 4 Pm thick weather had some drizzling rain.

Middle part the wind veered to the N.W. moderating, the ship on larboard tack, Satter part strong wind from N.W. steering S.S.E. under double reefed topsail, gill, and courses at 11 Am set whole topsail, at noon set the light sail, saw grampuses.

Remarks Friday November 21st.

Light breeze from the Westward steering S.S.E. with considerable swell on

Middle part light breeze the wind veered to N.W. steering S.S.E. Satter part in the morning strong breeze from the North steering S.E. the wind increasing, at 7 Am brought the ship to the wind heading E.S.E. under double reefed main topsail, foresail and fore topmast staysail. Having thick changeable weather, at 9 Am close reefed the main topsail furlled the foresail and set the fore staysail, started one bl of old beef, one bl of new beef and one bl of pork. Saw porpoises in the morning.

Remarks Saturday November 22nd.

A moderate gale from the N.W. with thick weather, about 1 Pm were round and headed N.W. saw a merchant ship steering to the S.E. with a main royal set, at sunset had some drizzling rain heading N.W.

Middle part the wind veered to N.W. moderating heading to the S.W. Satter part fresh breeze from the N.W. heading North at 6 Am heading to the S.E. at 6.30 Am saw a right whale working to windward lowered without success. The whale going quick porpoises around him.
