

Remarks On Board Ship Janus Of New Bedford, Mass.

Remarks Thursday December 18th.

Sight breeze from E.S.E. heading S.E. at 2.30 Pm finished cutting and began to boil. Middle part light breeze baffling to the North heading Eastward. Satter part light breeze from the South heading to the N.W. The wind veering Westward. employed boiling, saw Finbacks.

Satt 35.07 S. Song 7.51 E.

Remarks Friday December 19th.

Sight breeze from the N.W. heading Westward employed boiling saw porpoise caught one. at 4 Pm saw two right whales to leeward working to windward lowered for them without success the captain thinks that I galled them. at sunset shortened sail.

Middle part light air and calm at 3 Am finished boiling. Satter part light air & calm heading Westward. employed breaking out for shocks.

Satt 34.59 S. Song 8.03 E.

Remarks Saturday December 20th.

Sight breeze from the South steering N.W.W. saw Finbacks and porpoises at sunset furled the light sails.

Middle part light breeze from the South baffling Eastward steering N.W.W. Satter part light breeze from the Eastward steering N.W.W. at 9 Am. hauled to the wind and headed to the S.E. employed drying bone, saw porpoises.

Satt 34.58 S. Song 7.10 E.

Remarks Sunday December 21th.

Sight breeze from the Eastward heading to the S.E. saw porpoise caught one one sail in sight. started about 50 bl of the oil into the tank.

Middle part the same at 1 Am hauled aback the main topsail. Satter part light breeze from the S.E. baffling to the North heading Eastward. one mired at man in sight.

at 5.30 Am saw a right whale to leeward working to the windward lowered for him and succeeded in capturing him. at 7.15 Am took him alongside at 9.30 Am hauled on, at noon finished cutting.

Satt 35.07 S. Song 7.51 E.

Remarks Monday December 22nd.

Sight breeze from the North baffling Westward heading West and N.W. saw Finbacks at sunset double reefed the topsails, employed boiling.

Middle part light breeze from N.W. the ship on both tacks. Satter part light breeze from the N.W. steering N.W.W. employed boiling.

Satt 35.07 S. Song 7.37 E.

Captain Joseph H. Cornell. A. D. 1862.

Remarks Tuesday December 23rd.

Sight breeze from the S.W. heading to the S.E. boiling, saw Finbacks at sunset shortened sail, started 2 bl of beef and one bl of pork.

Middle part light breeze from the South the ship on both tacks during the night, at 11 Pm finished boiling.

Satter part fresh breeze from the South heading E.S.E. finished scraping the bone started one cask of fresh water into the butt, saw Finbacks.

Satt 34.56 S. Song 8.12 E.

Remarks Wednesday December 24th.

Fresh breeze from the South heading to the S.W. saw Finbacks at sunset shortened sail. Middle part the same.

Satter part light breeze from the S.S.E. heading to the S.W. employed stowing down the oil saw Finbacks, opened a cask of flour.

Satt 35.18 S. Song 7.58 E.

Remarks Thursday December 25th.

Sight air from the S.S.E. heading Eastward saw 4 right whales going to the Westward very quick. finished stowing, stowed down by the gauge of the cask 155.05 there is about 15 bl of whale oil in the tank and cooler.

Middle part light air and calm. Satter part light breeze from the N.W.W. steering different courses from E.S.E. to N.E. saw a number of Finbacks, porpoises, and porpoises, employed drying bone.

Satt 35.07 S. Song 7.52 E.

Remarks Friday December 26th.

Sight breeze from the N.W.W. steering E.S.E. saw Finbacks and porpoises. Middle part light breeze from the N.W.W. steering E.S.E.

at 3 Am hauled aback the main topsail. Satter part light breeze from N.W.W. steering E.S.E. haze weather, employed breaking out between decks at 11 Am saw sperm whale to leeward luff to the wind and hauled the main topsail aback heading to the North. The whale working to windward.

Remarks Saturday December 27th.

Sight breeze from the N.W.W. at 12.30 Pm lowered for the whales without success about 3 Pm it came in thick fog and sailing had a fog squall the wind veered to South at 4.30 the boats returned on board, at 5 Pm it cleared away

saw more whales ahead lowered for them they were going to the S.E. at sunset went alongside of one, struck him with one iron but it came out again not tugged. at dusk the boats returned on board and shortened sail.
