

Remarks On Board Ship Janus of New Bedford, Mass.

Fresher part fresh breeze from the S.E. heading E.S.E. like cut provisions, started one bl of Baf, one bl of Pork, and some meal, saw a finback.

Lat 30.30 S.

Long 9.26 E.

Remarks Saturday January 18th.

Fresh breeze from the S.E. heading Eastward saw one sail, unrove the cutting tackle.

Middle part strong breeze from the S.E. heading E.S.

Latter part the same, employed washing the lower mast, saw two sails steering to the N.W.

Lat 29.42 S.

Long 11.12 E.

Remarks Sunday January 19th.

Strong breeze from the S.E. heading E.S. painted the iron work around the lower mast all white, at sunset double reefed the topsails.

Middle part strong breeze from the South heading E.S.E.

Latter part strong breeze from the South heading E.S.E. under whole topsail, jib and courses, smoky and haze, saw finbacks and porpoises, saw three pieces of kelp.

Long 12.58 E.

Remarks Monday January 19th.

Strong breeze from the South backing to S.W. heading to the S.E. at 3 P.M. double reefed the topsails, at sunset were round and headed West, under close reefed main topsail, foresail, fore topmast staysail, and main spencer.

Middle part the same.

Latter part strong breeze from the South, at daylight were round and headed to the S.E. under double reefed topsails, jib, and courses.

Lat 28.00 S.

Long 13.31 E.

Remarks Tuesday January 20th.

Strong breeze from the South heading to the S.E. smoky and rugged weather, parted the starboard fore topsail sheet saw grampuses heaving, at sunset took in sail, were round and headed to the N.W. under three close reefed topsails, foresail, fore topmast staysail.

Middle part the same heading N.W. the breeze moderating.

Latter part fresh breeze from the South, at daylight were round and headed S.E. thick smoky weather, saw grampuses, employed getting the mizen royal mast rigging.

Remarks Wednesday January 21st.

Fresh breeze from the South heading S.E. saw two humpbacks going to windward, at sunset were round and headed to the N.W. under double reefed fore and main topsails, jib and courses.

Middle part light breeze from South heading N.W.

Latter part light breeze from the South heading N.W. at daylight set all sail,

employed overhauling the blocks, left and made a new forestay to the mizen topsail yard, saw a humpback.

Long 13.32 E.

Remarks Thursday January 22nd.

Fresh breeze from the South heading N.W. saw humpbacks, at sunset double reefed the topsails, and furled the mainsail, the breeze increasing.

Middle part strong breeze from the S.E. heading to the S.W. took in the jib.

Latter part strong breeze from the S.E. heading to the S.W. set jib and mainsail in the morning at 11 Am. The wind veered to South heading N.W., saw humpbacks.

Lat 29.56 S.

Long 12.02 E.

Remarks Friday January 23rd.

Strong breeze from the South heading N.W. employed overhauling the main top gallant halyard block, saw porpoises, caught one, at sunset furled the jib and mainsail.

Middle part strong breeze from S.E. heading to the S.W.

Latter part strong breeze from the South steering N.E. by W. sent down the main topsail to mend it. The wind flew.

Lat 29.37 S.

Long 11.25 E.

Remarks Saturday January 24th.

Strong breeze from the South steering N.E. by W. saw a humpback, saw a Barbantime steering to the N.W. finished the main topsail and hoist it again, at sunset double reefed the topsails, furled the jib, and hauled up the foresail.

Middle part stiff breeze from South heading Eastward with the main topsail aback.

Latter part stiff breeze from the South steering N.E. by W. saw finbacks and porpoises, sent down the fore top gallant sail to repair it.

Lat 29.47 S.

Long 11.34 E.

Remarks Sunday January 25th.

Fresh breeze from the South steering N.E. by W. saw finbacks, finished the fore top gallant sail and hoist it, at sunset the ship under double reefed fore and main topsails.

Middle part fresh breeze from the S.W. steering N.E. by W. at 12 midnight.

Left the ship to the wind heading Eastward with the main topsail aback.

Latter part strong breeze from the S.W. steering N.E. under whole topsails and foresail.

Lat 25.35 S.

Long 11.52 E.

Remarks Monday January 26th.

Strong breeze from the S.W. steering N.E. at sunset double reefed the topsails, hauled up the foresail and left to the wind heading to the S.E. the wind increasing, with glow saw a spout once and a few pieces of kelp. The captain tumbled with pins about him.
