

Remarks On Board Ship James G. New Bedford, Mass.

Middle part strong wind and heavy from the S. W. heading to the S. E.
Latter part fresh breeze from the S. W. moderating steering East and E. N. E.

Sat 2.4.20 S. Long 12.44 E.

Remarks Tuesday January 27th.

Fresh breeze from the S. W. steering E. N. E. at 4 Pm strong breeze, at sunset double reefed the fore and main topsails, hauled, and clewed up foresail and mizen topsail and steered North.

Middle part strong breeze from the S. W. steering North at 1 Am light to the wind heading West with main topsail aback. Latter part fresh breeze from the S. W. steering N. E. & N. took the bone up on deck to air it.

Sat 2.2.20 S. Long 12.32 E.

Remarks Wednesday January 28th.

Fresh breeze from the S. W. steering N. E. & N. at shortened sail the same as last night and steered North.

Middle part light breeze from the S. W. steering North saw Blackfish around the ship struck one and hauled from him at 11 Am light to the wind with the main topsail aback heading Westward. Latter part light breeze from the S. W. steering North calm in the morning employed washing the ship inside with lye.

Sat 2.1.25 S. Long 12.13 E.

Remarks Thursday January 29th.

Light breeze from the S. W. steering North employed washing the ship outside at sunset shortened sail and steered N. W.

Middle part the same. caught a porpoise.

Latter part light baffling air with calm steering North, employed getting a spare boat from off the beaver, and cleaning iron work outside. saw porpoises.

Sat 2.0.55 S. Long 11.35 E.

Remarks Friday January 30th.

Light air from the N. W. steering North at 5 Pm saw Blackfish lowered and caught three, saw porpoises.

Middle part light air baffling, employed taking the blubber off of the Blackfish.

Latter part light air from the North baffling Westward heading N. E. and North. saw grampuses and porpoises employed cleaning the iron work outside and painting it red passed through some tide rips. finished getting the spare boat.

Sat 2.0.32 S. Long 11.29 E.

Captain Joseph H. Cornell, A. D. 1863.

Remarks Saturday January 31st.

Light air from the West heading N. E. started one bl of Beef and one bl of Pork, at sunset started the try works boiling.

Middle part light air from the Eastward heading to the North with the main topsail aback part of the time at 12 m finished boiling the three fish making three bl of oil, caught a porpoise. Latter part light air from the South heading North and N. W. employed painting the boats on the beaver white. saw grampuses.

Sat 1.9.50 S. Long 11.01 E.

Remarks Sunday February 1st.

Light air from the South steering N. W. at 4 Pm wet the oil, saw a finback.

Middle part light breeze from the South steering N. W. Latter part light breeze from the South steering N. E. saw Blackfish going to the Westward, did not lower for them, saw a large Sunfish.

Sat 1.8.50 S. Long 10.28 E.

Remarks Monday February 2nd.

Light breeze from the South steering N. W. saw grampuses.

Middle part light breeze from the South steering N. W. Latter part light air from the South steering N. E. & N.

Sat 1.7.09 S. Long 10.33 E.

Remarks Tuesday February 3rd.

Light breeze from the S. W. steering E. N. E.

Middle part light breeze from the South steering E. N. E. and N. W. Latter part light breeze from the South steering East saw porpoises, at 9 Am saw the Coast of Africa bearing to the S. E.

Sat 1.6.00 Long 11.15 E.

Remarks Wednesday February 4th.

Light breeze from the Westward steering East saw two humpbacks at sunset steering N. W. the beaver in the shore in sight from mast head.

Middle part light breeze from the S. W. steering N. W. and N. E. at 1 Am hauled the main topsail aback heading Eastward. Latter part light air from the South steering to S. W. steering East. Land in sight, saw porpoises and a turtle.

Sat 1.5.15 S. Long 11.53 E.

Remarks Thursday February 5th.

Light breeze from the S. W. steering in for Little Fish Bay, at about 5 Pm anchored in Little Fish Bay harbor in a gulf.
