

Remarks On Board Ship James O. New Bedford, Mass.

of water with 60 fathoms of cable and lightest anchor
saw a merchant Brig going out bound to the North, saw a humpback.

Middle part lying at anchor.

Satter part light air baffling from the N.W. employed painting outside
took in the outer bel-stay and lifted the cap from off the foremast.

Remarks Friday February 6th.

Sight breeze from the N.W. employed painting, sent a raft of water cask ashore.

Middle part lying at anchor.

Satter part light breeze from the N.W. employed painting and breaking
cut for flour to trade, took off the raft of fresh water.

Remarks Saturday February 7th.

Sight breeze from the N.W. employed painting, received on board
a small Bull, killed and dressed him 3 bags sweet potatoes, 1 bag Irish P.

Middle part lying at anchor.

Satter part the same with a light breeze from the N.W. employed painting
and taring, the Starboard watch ashore on liberty, sent ashore two bags of
Butter, 2 1/4 quarter bags of Flour, received on board 1 bag of sweet potatoes.

Remarks Sunday February 8th.

Fresh breeze from the N.W. sent ashore 20 quarter bags of Flour, 1 small cask Powder
sent to a Spanish Brigantine 100 of bread at dusk part of the watch on board
5 of the men stopped on shore without liberty to do so.

Middle part lying at anchor.

Satter part light air from the Westward, the rest of the watch came on
board this morning, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty and
those of the Starboard watch that came on board at sunset last evening
the others having brake their liberty remained on board.

Remarks Monday February 9th.

Sight breeze from the N.W. at dusk the watch all on board excepting two
of the men George Barron and Morrit Wilson the last named being on duty
supposed to have deserted, the rest remaining on shore, having permission to do so.

Middle part lying at anchor.

Satter part light breeze from the N.W. the Starboard watch ashore
on liberty, sent ashore two bags of Butter and 8 quarter bags of Flour.

Remarks Tuesday February 10th.

Sight breeze from the N.W. employed stowing water, &c.
at sunset the watch all on board.

Middle part lying at anchor.

Captain Joseph H. Cornell, A.D. 1863.

Satter part light breeze from the Westward, employed hauling land the outer bel-stay
and getting off potatoes, received on board 37 bags of Irish potatoes and 2 bags sweet
potatoes, fixed the head of the foremast and put the cap on.

Remarks Wednesday February 11th.

Sight breeze from the N.W. sent a raft of water cask ashore.

Middle part lying at anchor.

Satter part fresh breeze from the S.W. in the morning took of the
raft of water, received on board 17 bags of Irish potatoes, and 18 bags of
sweet potatoes, started one M of Beef and one M of Pork.

Remarks Thursday February 12th.

Fresh breeze from the S.W. received on board about 75 fish and 2 bags
of Onions, also two Portuguese men shipped to the ship.

Middle part lying at anchor.

Satter part light breeze from the S.W. at sunrise took the anchor
at about 7 AM the Custom House Officer brought off the ship's papers
took the guards out of the ship, then we took our departure steering
N.W. George Barron and Morrit Wilson have deserted while lying here.

Sat 15. 13 S. Long 11. 37 E.

Remarks Friday February 13th.

Sight breeze from the S.W. baffling Westward, employed pecking the cables
hauled up the spare cable, and cleaned out the chain locker at sunset heading N.W.

Middle part light breeze from the S.W. heading N.W.

Satter part light air from the S.W. heading N.W. employed cleaning the cables.

Sat 15. 15 S. Long 10. 55 E.

Remarks Saturday February 14th.

Sight breeze from the S.W. heading N.W. employed cleaning the cables
oiled and stowed down the spare cable.

Middle part fresh breeze from the S.W. steering N.W.

Satter part light breeze from the S.W. steering N.W. employed cleaning
the cables, oiled and stowed down the Starboard cable.

Sat 14. 33 S. Long 7. 59 E.

Remarks Sunday February 15th.

Sight breeze from the S.W. steering N.W. finished cleaning the cables, oiled and stowed
down the Starboard cable then washed the deck off, at sunset trimmed the sails.

Middle part light breeze from the S.W. baffling steering N.W.

Satter part light breeze from the S.W. steering N.W. one sail in sight ahead.

Sat 14. 45 S. Long 6. 39 E.
