

Remarks On Board Ship, *Janus* of New Bedford, Mass.

Middle part light breeze and calm, steered to the leeward of the Island.
 Latter part Strong breeze from the S.E. heading S.W. by S. the Island in sight, at 10 Am. suddenly took in the light sail.

Remarks Friday February 27th.

Strong breeze from the S.E. heading S.W. under whole topsail, gill, and courses.

Middle part fresh breeze from the S.E. heading S.W.

Latter part Strong breeze from the S.E. baffling heading S.W. at daylight tacked and headed to the S.E.

Remarks Saturday February 28th.

Strong breeze from the S.E. heading S.E. one sail in sight at 6 Am spoke the bark Joseph Maxwell of Fairhaven Captain Jensen 42 months out with 950 barrels of sperm oil, bound to St Helena and Home.

Middle part Strong breeze from the S.E. heading S.E.

Latter part Strong breeze from the S.E. heading S.E. the Island St Helena in sight, took the whale oil out of the tank and put it into casks. There is about 13 bbl of whale oil, broke out some small stores, at noon tacked.

Sail 16, 25 S.

Long S. 14 W.

Remarks Sunday March 1st.

Fresh breeze from the S.E. heading to the S.W. saw two sails, at sunset hoisted the light sail, and hoisted up the courses, land in sight.

Middle part fresh breeze from the S.E. heading S.W. at 10

Pm were round and headed to the S.E.

Latter part light breeze from the S.E. steering N.E. by E for the Island bent the cables and got the anchor off the beam, saw one sail.

Remarks Monday March 2nd.

Fresh breeze from the S.E. steering for the Island, at 1.30 Pm anchored off Jamestown in 25 fathoms of water with 60 fathoms of cable.

Middle part laying at anchor had some light rain.

Latter part light breeze employed breaking out whale oil.

Remarks Tuesday March 3rd.

Light breeze, employed setting up pipe shoos to stow salt water in.

Middle part laying at anchor.

Latter part light breeze, employed setting up shoos, stowed down some salt water.

Remarks Wednesday March 4th.

Light breeze employed setting up pipe shoos for salt water.

Middle part laying at anchor with a fine breeze.

Latter part light air, sent on board the Ship Congress of New Bedford Captain Costine, 4 lighter loads of whale oil, to be shipped home by her.

Remarks Thursday March 5th.

Light air broke out all the whale oil sent on board the Congress & lighter loads of whale oil to be shipped home by her.

Middle part laying at anchor with a fine breeze.

Latter part light breeze sent on board the Congress & lighter load of whale oil to be shipped home by her, stowed down some salt water.

Remarks Friday March 6th.

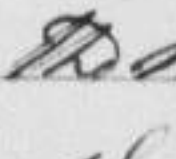
Light breeze sent the remainder of the whale oil on board the Ship Congress to be shipped home by her, employed breaking out the sperm oil.

Middle part laying at anchor with a fine breeze.

Latter part light breeze, sent on board the Congress 3 lighter loads of sperm oil to be shipped home by her, had some rain, received on board 8 oil cask bought from the Congress three gauges amounting to about 946 gallons, received on board 10 of our own cask the whale oil having been emptied out of them into the tank on board the Congress and 4 empty cask that we sent on board the Congress, to stow, one cask was an mudge of about one barrel of whale oil.

Remarks Saturday March 7th.

Light breeze, sent on board the Congress 2 lighter loads of sperm oil, and 40 bundles of whalebone, to be shipped home by her, delivered on board the Congress of New Bedford Captain Costine at the Island St Helena, 10,573 gallons of whale oil, 6,882 gallons of sperm oil and 40 bundles of whalebone, weighing about 2,900 pounds. The amount of oil is reckoned from the gauges on the cask.

The cask are numbered and marked J. A. N. U. S. with the marking iron, on every head. The whalebone is marked  with the marking iron. The oil and whalebone to be shipped to New Bedford.

Middle part laying at anchor with a fresh breeze.

Latter part fresh breeze the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty, employed breaking out for Beef and Pork.

Remarks Sunday March 8th.

Fresh breeze, delivered to the Bark Louise of New Bedford Captain Steen 15 barrels of Beef, 15 barrels of Pork, and 3 casks of Bread, the gauging of the cask were as follows 198, 173, 195.
