Latter part fresh trader heading S.W. signalled a Danish Ship, saw porpoises, employed getting cutting block ships &c.

Latt 17.25 S. Long 71.31 W.

Remarks Friday May 8th.

Light trader heading South, at sunset tacked and headed to the N.E. hauled up the courses and double reefed the topsails.

Middle part fresh trader heading to the N.E.

Latter part squally at daylight tacked and headed South at 2.30 P.M. Steering N.W. sent down the Mizzen Stay and stripped it.

Remarks Saturday May 9th.

Fresh trader with squalls and rain steering N.W. at 2.30 P.M.



saw a white water, at 3.30 P.M. saw a

Sperm Whale off the weather bow working to the S.W. lowered for him, at sunset struck him, at 8 P.M. took the whale along side.

Middle part light trader lying by the whale, employed getting the cutting gear ready. considerable swell on

Latter part light trader employed cutting the whale, saw a Gumbo

Latt 17.20 S. Long 71.30 W.

Remarks Sunday May 10th.

Light trader at 5 P.M. finished cutting the body.

Middle part light trader employed boiling body.

Latter part light trader employed taking in the gun and case, boiling body and bailing the case.

Latt 17.30 S. Long 71.36 W.

Remarks Monday May 11th.

Light trader boiling body, finished bailing the case, at sunset wore ship and headed to the N.E. started one lll of Body and one lll of Pork.

Middle part light trader heading to the N.E. boiling saw one sail.

Latter part light trader heading to the South, employed boiling the head.

Latt 17.30 S. Long 71.33 W.

Remarks Tuesday May 12th.

Light trader heading South, boiling, saw porpoises, at sunset double reefed the topsails, wore round and headed to the N.E.

Middle part light trader heading to the N.E.

at 2 P.M. finished boiling.

Captain Joseph H. Cornell, A.D. 1863.

Latter part light trader heading to the N.E. saw two Gumbo's, opened a cask of Bread.

Latt 17.08 S. Long 71.14 W.

Remarks Wednesday May 13th.

Light trader heading to the N.E. saw one sail.

Middle part light trader heading Eastward.

Latter part light trader heading to the S.W. employed in ship's duty, saw several sails, one a whaler heading Eastward.

Latt 16.55 S. Long 71.04 W.

Remarks Thursday May 14th.

Light trader heading to the S.W. saw gunner's heaving, saw two sails one a whaler, finished the Mizzen Stay, at sunset double reefed the topsails, at 6.30 P.M. spoke the Bark *Cornelia* of New Bedford Captain Poole 2 years out with 600 bbl's Spum Oil.

Middle part light trader heading to the S.W. main spread aback, Latter part light trader heading Eastward, saw several sails.

Latt 17.00 S. Long 71.02 W.

Remarks Friday May 15th.

Light trader heading Eastward, employed in ship's duty at 5 P.M. spoke the Bark *Sea Breeze* of New Bedford Captain Nick's boiling a large whale.

Middle part light trader heading Eastward

Latter part light trader heading to the S.W. saw several sails.

Latt 16.53 S. Long 71.51 W.

Remarks Saturday May 16th.

Light trader heading to the S.W. at sunset tacked and headed S.E. sealed the light sails.

Middle part fresh trader the ship on both tacks during the night.

Latter part fresh trader heading to the S.W. saw a small white water, at noon tacked and headed East.

Latt 17.30 S. Long 71.47 W.

Remarks Sunday May 17th.

Fresh trader steering E.N.E. at 3 P.M. saw a school of Sperm Whales working to the N.W. at 4.30 P.M. lowered for them, there had been porpoises among them.



at sunset succeeded in striking one and capturing him at 8 P.M. took him along side the ship *Janus*.

Middle part employed getting the cutting gear ready.
