

Remarks On Board Ship Janus of New Bedford, Mass.

Remarks Saturday June 6th.

Light trader heading E.N.E. saw a whaleship to windward at sunset tacked to the S.W.

Middle part fresh trader heading S.W. at midnight took in light sail.



Latter part fresh trader at daylight tacked to the E.S.E. at 6.30 Am saw a school of Sperm Whales to leeward lowered for them and succeeded in capturing two, at noon had them alongside.

Remarks Sunday June 7th.

Light trader employed cutting at 1 Pm hooked on at 4 Pm finished cutting one whale employed bailing his case cutting up the yale, and getting ready for boiling.

Middle part fresh trader, boiling body, and trying by the whale.

Latter part strong trader, boiling, cut in the other whale.

Remarks Monday June 8th.

Strong trader, employed boiling and bailing the case, at sunset were round and headed E.S.E.

Middle part the same

Latter part fresh trader with flares, heading Eastward, employed boiling.

Lat 16.55 S.

Long 5.36 W.

Remarks Tuesday June 9th.

Fresh trader heading Eastward, employed boiling.

Middle part fresh trader the wind flares heading Eastward

Latter part fresh trader with flares heading Eastward employed boiling the head, St Helena in sight to leeward, saw a number of merchantmen, and one whaler, saw porpoises.

Lat 16.20 S.

Long 5.21 W.

Remarks Wednesday June 10th.

Fresh trader, boiling head, at 2 Pm were round and headed S.W. saw several sails.

Middle part fresh trader baffling with squalls of wind quite fresh heading Southward at 3 Pm finished boiling.

Latter part light trader baffling with flares of wind heading South and S.E. saw grampuses spouting thought they were whales, saw one seal, a merchantman employed clearing up the deck and washed it off, saw porpoises.

Remarks Thursday June 11th.

Light trader baffling with flares wind heading South & S.E. saw two merchantmen.

Middle part light trader baffling to the South heading to the S.W.

Latter part light trader baffling the wind very light with flares and light rain, heading Southward, started all the Booby Oil into the tank excepting a 600 cask, at noon were round and headed East, saw several merchantmen.

Long 5.33 W.

Remarks Friday June 12th.

Light trader heading E.S. the wind very light nearly calm, started one 600 of Beef, one 600 of Pork, and opened one keg of Butter.

Middle part light trader well to the South heading E.S.E.

Latter part light trader baffling heading Eastward employed stowing down the oil, saw several merchantmen & one whaler, saw a Jimback & porpoises.

Lat 16.58 S.

Long 4.57 W.

Remarks Saturday June 13th.

Light trader heading E.S.E. finished stowing the oil, stowed down by the gauges of the cask 96 600 of Sperm Oil, saw several merchantmen at sunset tacked and headed South, have got 6 600 of Fat lean Oil.

Middle part light trader heading E.S.W.

Latter part light trader baffling at daylight tacked and headed to the S.E. saw a Jimback and several merchantmen.

Lat 17.00 S.

Long 4.37 W.

Remarks Sunday June 14th.

Light trader heading to the S.E. at sunset tacked and headed S.W.

Middle part light trader baffling heading to the S.W.

Latter part light trader well to the South heading N.W. saw two merchantmen, saw Jimback and porpoises.

Lat 17.34 S.

Long 5.14 W.

Remarks Monday June 15th.

Light trader stowing N.W. saw Jimbacks, at sunset hoisted up the courses, and furlled the light sails.

Middle part light trader baffling heading Eastward.

Latter part light trader at 7 Am were round and headed to the S.E. employed overhauling the lower cutting blocks and straps, set up 6 pipe shores for fresh water, saw a Jimback.
