

Remarks On Board Ship Janus of New Bedford, Mass.

Middle part light air the ship laying at anchor.
 Latter part light trades, had some rain sent in a cask of cash for fresh water, at 9.30 Am took the raft alongside, delivered to the Black Sea Breeze of New Bedford 7 bl of Pork, employed stowing away the water, fixed the shackel to the outer Bob stay, and sent the flying fib and sent it in.

Remarks Thursday June 25th.

Sight trades finished stowing away the water, and washed off the deck.

Middle part light trades

Latter part fresh trades, loosed the sails to dry, employed painting and taring, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty.

Remarks Friday June 26th.

Sight trades, stripped and overhauled the starboard flying fib guy.

Middle part light trades

Latter part light trades the Starboard watch all on board in the morning. The Starboard watch went ashore on liberty, stripped and overhauled the starboard fib guy, employed scraping the paint on the stern.

Remarks Saturday June 27th.

Sight trades employed in ship's duty.

Middle part light trades

Latter part fresh trades the Starboard watch all on board in the morning. The Starboard watch went ashore on liberty, stripped and overhauled the hizen topmast backstays, in wake of the crogie yard.

Remarks Sunday June 28th.

Strong breeze with squalls of wind and rain, employed in ship's duty.

Middle part the same.

Latter part strong trades the Starboard watch all on board in the morning, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty.

Remarks Monday June 29th.

Strong trades with squalls of wind and rain.

Middle part the same.

Latter part fresh trades, employed in ship's duty.

Remarks Tuesday June 30th.

Fresh trades employed painting the stern & cutting wood, had some rain.

Middle part the same fresh trades

Latter part strong trades employed painting, and cutting wood, the Starboard watch all on board in the morning. The Starboard watch went ashore on liberty, started one bl of Pork, & one bl of Pork.

Remarks Wednesday July 1st.

Fresh trades employed cutting wood, received on board 500 bl of Pumpkins, and 4 bags of sweet potatoes.

Middle part fresh trades

Latter part fresh trades the Starboard watch all on board in the morning, sent in a cask of 4 cask for fresh water at noon took them alongside and hoisted them in, employed cutting wood from off the slave vessel, bent the old flying fib.

Remarks Thursday July 2nd.

Fresh trades with squalls and rain, sent ashore one bl of Pork and one bl of Whale Oil, stowed down the water, employed cutting wood, received on board 2 bags of sweet potatoes.

Middle part the same.

Latter part fresh trades, received on board 3 best loads of wood, 3 cutting spades, one blubber hook, started one bl of Pork, & opened a cask of Bread.

Remarks Friday July 3rd.

Fresh trades finished breaking up and stowing away the wood, at 4 Pm the Captain came on board, took the anchor and went to sea, at sunset steering W by N.

Middle part strong trades with squalls, steering W by N.

Latter part the same, set the main top gallant sail, employed lashing the anchors, oiling the cables, and stowing them away.
