

## Remarks On Board Ship James O. New Bedford, Mass.

Middle part fresh breeze from the Westward heading to the S.S.W.  
 Latter part fresh breeze from the Westward heading S.S.W. to S.W. saw a Ginkack.  
 Lat<sup>t</sup> 28.00 S. Long 31.53 W.

Remarks Tuesday September 29<sup>th</sup>.

Fresh breeze from the Westward heading S.S.W. to S.W.  
 Middle part fresh breeze the wind veering South, steering S.W.  
 Latter part strong breeze from the North steering S.W. unbent the  
 main topsail for repair, at 11 Am it began to rain, saw two small  
 turtles, at noon squally with wind and rain.

Remarks Wednesday September 30<sup>th</sup>.

Strong wind from the N.E. and rainy weather steering S.W. bent the  
 main topsail, and rose new main top gallant sheets, the wind backing and moderating,  
 Middle part the wind veered to N.W.W. with a strong breeze  
 heading to the S.W. double reefed the topsails.  
 Latter part strong wind from the N.W.W. heading to the S.W. under double  
 reefed topsails, jib, and courses had a few squalls saw a Ginkack.  
 Lat<sup>t</sup> 31.02 S. Mistake in Long 36.22 W.

Remarks Thursday October 1<sup>st</sup>.

Strong wind from Westward backing, heading S.W. & S.W. by S. saw a Ginkack & porpoises.  
 Middle part strong breeze from the Westward heading  
 to the S.W. set some sail.  
 Latter part fresh breeze from the N.W.W. heading S.W. broke out  
 glow, twine, and tar, set all sail, saw a Ginkack.  
 Lat<sup>t</sup> 32.14 S. Long 35.10 W.

Remarks Friday October 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Fresh breeze from the N.W.W. backing to the N.W. heading S.W. at sunset heading N.S.W.  
 Middle part fresh breeze from the S.W. heading N.S.W.  
 Latter part light air backing with calm, light drizzling rain and  
 thick weather, at 11 Am light air from the South heading N.S.W. saw Ginkacks.

Remarks Saturday October 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Light breeze from the South backing Eastward steering N.S.W.  
 at 4 Pm fresh breeze from the Eastward steering N.S.W. all sail set  
 had some drizzling rain, at sunset the breeze freshened.  
 Middle part fresh breeze the wind veered to the  
 S.E. steering N.S.W. the fore topsail the part of.

## Captain Joseph H. Cornell, A.D. 1863.

Latter part strong breeze from the S.W. heading to the N.W.W.  
 the wind backing, saw one sail heading to the South.  
 Lat<sup>t</sup> 33.32 S. Long 39.27 W.

Remarks Sunday October 4<sup>th</sup>.

Strong wind from the S.W. backing West heading to the N.W. at 3 Pm tacked  
 and headed to the S.S.W. saw a Ginkack, at sunset double reefed the topsails.  
 Middle part strong wind from the S.W. backing heading south-  
 ward, had a few squalls, at 9 Pm wore round and headed to the N.W.W.  
 Latter part strong wind with squalls from the S.W. backing with lull  
 heading to the N.W.W. set whole fore & main topsails, saw a Ginkack.  
 Lat<sup>t</sup> 32.53 S. Long 40.25 W.

Remarks Monday October 5<sup>th</sup>.

Strong breeze with squalls and lull, the wind heading to the N.W.W. saw  
 a Ginkack, found the main topmast rotten, about a foot above the cap  
 Middle part fresh breeze from the S.W. heading to the N.W.W.  
 Latter part light breeze from the S.W. backing heading Westward, nearly  
 calm at noon, examined the main topmast and found a bad place  
 in it, sent it down, employed making a new topmast.

Remarks Tuesday October 6<sup>th</sup>.

Light air and calm, at 4 Pm light air from the N.W.W. heading to  
 the S.W. employed repairing the main topsail, &c.  
 Middle part light air and calm.  
 Latter part fresh breeze from the N.W.E. steering S.W. finished  
 repairing the main topsail, and repaired the main top gallant sail, in  
 the morning exchanged signals with a Dutch Bark heading to the Eastward.  
 Lat<sup>t</sup> 32.56 S. Long 42.37 W.

Remarks Wednesday October 7<sup>th</sup>.

Fresh breeze from the N.W.E. steering S.W. finished the main topmast  
 and sent it aloft, also sent aloft the main topsail yard.  
 Middle part fresh breeze from the N.W.E. steering S.W.  
 Latter part wind the same, steering S.W. in the morning bent the main  
 topsail, sent aloft the main top gallant mast, yard, and sail, at  
 noon all sail set, smoky and hazy weather.  
 Lat<sup>t</sup> 34.42 S. Long 44.51 W.

Remarks Thursday October 8<sup>th</sup>.

Light breeze from the N.W.E. steering S.W. smoky and hazy, saw Ginkacks.
