

Remarks On Board Ship Janus Of New Bedford Mass.

Middle part light breeze from the North baffling Westward steering SW.
at 10 Pm the wind veered to South, at 12 midnight light air from the SE, heading SSE.

Latter part light air and calm, the Land and two sails in sight off deck.
filled up the Butt, started two bl of Beef, and one bl of Pork.

Lat 55.13 S. Long 65.03 W.

Remark' Thursday October 29th.

Light air from the Westward with calm steering SW, at 7 Pm had a
squall from the South, took in sail to close reefed topsails and storm sails.

Middle part A moderate gale from the South with squalls, heading SSE.

Latter part strong wind from the South, at 5 Am wore round and headed
SW by W, set some sail, had a hail squall, at noon tacked and headed SSE by E.

The ship under whole topsails, jib and courses, the Land in sight.

Lat 55.18 S. Long 64.40 W.

Remark' Friday October 30th.

Fresh breeze from the South heading SSE by E, at 4 Pm tacked and
headed SW by W, set all sail, the Land and one merchantman in sight.

Middle part light air and calm, at 12 midnight light breeze from
the N. N. W. steering SW by S.

Latter part fresh and strong breezes from the N. N. W. steering SW by S,
thick weather, saw the Land and one sail in the morning, at about 9 Am the
wind increased to a moderate gale from the SW heading South, started the jib tacking it in.

Remark' Saturday October 31st.

A moderate gale from the SW by W heading South, thick, foggy weather,
went in the jib, repaired it and bent it again, saw one sail to leeward,
at sunset the ship under double reefed topsails, courses and storm sails.

Middle part the same, thick drizzling misty weather.

Latter part strong gale from SW by S heading South took in sail in the morning at 7 Am
wore round and headed NW by W, furled the foresail, parted the foot rope of the
mizzen topsail, the ship under close reefed fore and main topsails and storm sails.

Remark' Sunday November 1st.

Fresh gale from the SW by S, at 1 Pm wore round and headed S by E,
repaired the mizzen topsail, at 4 Pm wore round and headed NW by W.
The ship under close reefed topsails, courses and storm sails.

Middle part the same, the wind moderating at 9 Pm
it cleared away with starlight, had considerable dew.

Captain Joseph H. Cornell, A. D. 1863.

Latter part the wind veered to the NW, steering SW by W, with
all sail set the wind light, took in the bow and waist boat, some small from SW.
Lat 56.23 S. Long 66.48 W.

Remark' Monday November 2nd.

Light wind from the N. N. W. steering SW, the Land in sight being from West to NW,
saw porpoises & grampuses, at 5 Pm the wind veered to SW heading SSE, to SE, with a
strong breeze, at 7 Pm, strong breeze from the N. N. W. heading South, took in the light sails.

Middle part A moderate gale with strong glass from the N. N. W. heading SW by W,
under close reefed fore and main topsails, and storm sails.

Latter part more moderate, the wind veering Westward heading from SW by W to SW, at 9 Am
the ship under single reefed topsails, jib, spencer, courses, and storm sails, saw two
sails bound Eastward, at noon the wind increasing, the ship heading SW.

Lat 57.19 S. Long 67.23 W.

Remark' Tuesday November 3rd.

A moderate gale from the N. N. W. steering SW, under double reefed topsails,
jib and courses, at 4 Pm took in the jib, and close reefed the fore topsail,
at 6.30 Pm took in the courses and close reefed the main topsail, the wind
from the NW steering SW, wet weather, and heavy glass of wind.

Middle part A gale from the NW, with heavy glass and drizzling rain also being
seen, steering SW, under close reefed fore and main topsails, and storm sails.

Latter part moderate, the wind from the West baffling heading S. S. W. to SW, set all sail
during the forenoon, put another stop on the back rope of the fore topsail, &c.

Lat 57.55 S. Long 68.46 W.

Remark' Wednesday November 4th.

Fresh breeze from the N. N. W. baffling heading SW by S, all sail set, thick
cloudy and misty weather, filled up the Butt and opened a cask of Bread,
at 7 Pm the wind from the NW increasing steering W. S. W. took in light sails.

Middle part strong breeze from the NW, baffling steering W. S. W. foggy
with drizzling rain, at 12 Pm, double reefed the topsails, the wind glassy.

Latter part strong wind from the Westward, baffling heading SW to SW by S,
at 10 Am wore round and headed NW by W, cloudy weather the ship under
single reefed topsails, jib and courses.

Lat 58.32 S. Long 71.14 W.

Remark' Thursday November 5th.

Fresh breeze from the West baffling to the NW, at 1.30 Pm wore round and
headed to the SW, all sail set, repaired the flying jib, at 4 Pm steering W. S. W.
at 8 Pm strong breeze, took in the light sails.
