

Remarks On Board Ship Janus of New Bedford, Mass.

Middle part strong wind from the NW by N, baffling, steering N. S. W.

At 11 Pm double reefed the fore topsail, & close reefed the main topsail. Latter part strong wind with squalls from the NW, heading S. W. by W, made sail and took it in again, at noon squally weather, the ship under double reefed topsail &c.

Remarks Friday November 6th.

Strong wind with squalls from the NW, steering N. S. W. the wind baffling, at 4 Pm heading S. W. at 6 Pm wore round and headed to the NW, at 7 Pm the ship under double reefed topsail, fcb, courses, and storm sails, pitching into a head beat sea.

Middle part strong winds from the N. S. W. baffling, heading N. W. by N to N. W. by W. had several squalls of wind and hail, quite heavy, took in some sail.

Latter part strong wind from the West, baffling, heading to the NW, squally in the morning, at noon wore round and headed to the SW. the ship under single reefed topsail, fcb, courses, and storm sails.

Remarks Saturday November 7th.

Strong winds from the NW baffling heading S. W. to N. S. W. at 6 Pm double reefed the topsail, heading N. S. W. secured the Sails and anchor, the rig stiffer partly gone.

Middle part A moderate gale from the NW, heading N. S. W. took in the fcb and mainsail, at 11 Pm wet and drizzling rainy weather.

Latter part the same, set the fcb and mainsail, at noon took in the fcb, the wind increasing, wet rainy weather, made new main tack.

Remarks Sunday November 8th.

A moderate gale from the NW, heading N. S. W. wet rainy weather took in mainsail, and close reefed the topsail.

Middle part the same with squalls heading West N. W. by S. wet rainy weather.

Latter part wind the same, but more moderate, heading N. S. W. and N. S. W. the ship under double reefed topsail, courses and storm sails.

Remarks Monday November 9th.

Fresh gale from the NW, heading N. S. W. squally weather, close reefed the topsail & furlled the courses, at 5 Pm, wore round and headed North.

Middle part the same heading North to N. N. W. under close reefed fore & main topsails & storm sails. Latter part more moderate with squalls, heading to the N. N. W. under double reefed topsails, fcb, courses, and storm sails, took in the fcb, at 11 Am wore round and headed N. S. W. and S. W. by W.

Remarks Tuesday November 10th.

A moderate gale from the NW, with squalls and wet rain, weather, heading S. W. by W. at 6 Pm the ship under close reefed main topsail, and storm sails, the wind increasing.

Middle part strong gale the wind veering to the SW, with heavy squalls, heading Southward, goose winged the main topsail.

At 12 m wore round and headed N. W. by W and N. N. W. squally.

Latter part moderating at 5 Am steering N. W. by N. made sail gradually at 10 Am steering NW with a strong breeze.

Remarks Wednesday November 11th.

Fresh breeze from the Westward, baffling, heading NW to N. N. W. parted the foot rope to the main top gallant sail, and tore the sail bad, bent a fore top gallant sail, instead, the other main top gallant sail, being in a cask. at 7 Pm wore round and headed to the SW.

Middle part strong breeze from the NW, baffling, heading S. W. to N. S. W. double reefed the topsails and furlled the fcb. wet rainy weather.

Latter part strong wind from the N. N. W. heading S. W. at 8 Am wore round and headed North N. W. set the fcb, and one reef out of the main & mizen topsails, thick & wet weather.

Remarks Thursday November 12th.

Strong wind from the Westward, heading N. S. W. & N. N. W. thick, wet, & damp weather.

Middle part strong wind at 10 Pm the wind veered to S. W. steering S. W.

Latter part fresh breeze from the Westward, baffling, heading NW & N. W. by N. all sail set, filled the bath, started 2 M's of Pork, and one M of Pork.

Latter part light breeze from the Westward, baffling, heading N. S. W. to N. N. W. at 7 Am tacked and headed to the S. W. about 9 Am tacked and headed to the N. S. W. employed repairing the main top gallant sail.

Slight breeze from the Westward, baffling, heading to the NW, bent a new Foresail, finished the main top gallant sail, and bent it.
