

Remarks On Board Ship James O. New Bedford, Mass.

board one hind quarter of fresh beef and 1 doz. Pumpkins,
Middle part lying at anchor.

Satter part light breeze from Westward the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty.

Remarks Sunday April 3rd.

Light breeze from the Westward, at 1 Pm, the Starboard watch came on board, received on board 60 bbl of Irish Potatoes, and a quarter of fresh beef, got the ship ready for sea, shifted and overhauled the fish trawl.

Middle part light air and calm, at midnight got the ship underweigh, nearly calm.

Satter part light air baffling, at 11 Am light breeze from N.W. steering N.W.

Remarks Monday April 4th.

Light breeze from N.W. steering N.W. at 3 Pm fresh trade wind, steering N.W. and N.W. by E.

Middle part light breeze from the Southward, steering N.W. by W. at 10 Pm lying with main topsail aback, heading to the S.W.

Satter part light breeze baffling, worked the ship up to Sabana, Main, at 9.30. Am anchored in 20 fathoms with 60 fathoms cable, took up the potatoes to dry them.

Remarks Tuesday April 5th.

Light breeze from the S.E. employed breaking out, making a potatoe bin &c.

Middle part light air lying at anchor.

Satter part light breeze baffling, sent a raft of casks ashore for fresh water employed drying and picking over potatoes, received on board 2 bags of sweet potatoes, a hind quarter of fresh beef.

Remarks Wednesday April 6th.

Light breeze from the S.W. filled 6 bbl with Whale Oil.

Middle part light air lying at anchor.

Satter part light air and calm took off the raft of water, and broke out at the after hatchway, the heads of 3 pipes broke in, in coming through the breakers.

Remarks Thursday April 7th.

Light breeze from S.E. employed stowing away the water, sent ashore 6 bbl of Whale Oil, in bbl containing 180 gallons by three gauges.

Middle part light air lying at anchor.

Satter part light baffling breeze sent a raft of casks ashore for fresh water and broke out at the fore hatchway, sent ashore 2 bbl of Whale Oil

in barrels containing 60 gallons by three gauges, started one cask of molasses, received on board some fresh beef, &c. also some sage.

Remarks Friday April 8th.

Light breeze from the S.W. took off a raft of water and stowed it away.

Middle part light breeze from the Southward lying at anchor.

Satter part fresh breeze from the S.E. in the morning, sent a raft of casks ashore for fresh water, at 7.30 Am moderated, broke out at the fore hatchway.

Remarks Saturday April 9th.

Light air, took off a raft of water, sent ashore 5 bbl of Whale Oil in barrels, containing 150 gallons by gauges, traded dark whale oil 10 gal for small onions, received on board 100 pumpkins for 10 gal dark whale oil.

Middle part light air lying at anchor.

Satter part light breeze from Westward baffling, took off a raft of fresh water, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty, received on board some fresh beef.

Remarks Sunday April 10th.

Light breeze from Westward baffling to the North, finished stowing at the fore hatchway, at sunset the watch came on board.

Middle part light air lying at anchor.

Satter part light baffling breeze, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty.

Remarks Monday April 11th.

Light breeze from the Westward, at sunset the watch came on board, had a heavy shower of rain, thunder, and lightning.

Middle part it cleared away.

Satter part light baffling breeze, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty, employed stowing water between decks, received on board some fresh beef and sweet potatoes.

Remarks Tuesday April 12th.

Light breeze from the S.W. received on board 10 bbl of sweet potatoes.

Middle part light air lying at anchor.

Satter part light air baffling, received on board 500 lb Sugar, 5 bbl of syrup & molasses, and 2 net of onions, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty.
