

Remarks On Board Ship James O. New Bedford Mass.

Remarks Wednesday April 13th.

Light breeze baffling from the North, at sunset the watch came on board. Middle part light air: lying at anchor.

Satter part light baffling breeze from the Southward, received on board one gross quarter of fresh beef, and one cord of wood, also 3 men shipped to the ship, their names are William Lescumb, Charles Wheeler, William De Vere.

Remarks Thursday April 14th.

Light air from Southward at 1 Pm took the anchor and stood out into the trade wind, which was quite strong steering W by N & West, at sunset saw the Island Oahu, traded at Sabina one 111 of condensed Pork & 21 dark molasses.

Middle part fresh trader steering W by N, at midnight lying with the fore topsail aback, heading E. S. E.

Satter part fresh trader at 7.30 Am anchored in 15 fathoms water outside the reef off Honolulu harbour, broke out some sperm body oil, saw several whaling vessels lying off and on, and at anchor here, received 2 letters &c.

Remarks Friday April 15th.

Fresh trader received on board 1 coil of rattine, & a gross quarter of fresh beef. Middle part fresh trader the ship lying at anchor.

Satter part fresh trader stowed down nearly 1 1/2 111 of head oil, received on board 4 coil bowline, and one case of beef.

Remarks Saturday April 16th.

Fresh trader employed in ship's duty.

Middle part fresh trader the ship lying at anchor.

Satter part fresh trader, received on board some lumber for a cutting stage and one box of Soap, sent on shore 1091 gallons of Sperm body oil, marked N & P, and numbered from 1 to 9 with the marking iron on both heads of each cask, also 32 bundles of Whalibone weighing 2447 pounds, marked D with red paint on the butt one side, and with marking iron on the butt the other side.

Remarks Sunday April 17th.

Strong trader, received on board 1 ton of Hard Coal, and a few slabs, received on board Mr William Baker, shipped as fourth mate and Joseph Michel shipped as

Satter part fresh trader at 8.30 Am took the anchor, the ship standing off and on.

at 10.30 Am the Captain came on board, saw two vessels to windward supposed to have the mail from San Francisco.

Remarks Monday April 18th.

Fresh trader the ship standing off and on at Honolulu at 1 Pm the Captain went on shore, at 4 Pm strong trader.

Middle part strong trader the ship standing off and on. Satter part strong trader with squalls, the ship standing off and on at Honolulu.

Remarks Tuesday April 19th.

Strong trader at 1.45 Pm sent a boat on shore, at 3.15 Pm the Captain came on board with two Kanakas, shipped to the ship, and took his departure, steering W. S. W. at sunset steering W by N.

Middle part strong trader

Satter part strong trader with squalls at 9.30 Am anchored off Kaloa, Aloa, in 14 fathoms of water let go the Port anchor, and the chain became foul, let go the Starboard anchor and brought her too we came very near going aground the ship. Adeline of New Bedford, Capt Barber, received on board 6 cord of wood, 8 dogs, 14 a bullock, bananas, cabbage, &c.

Remarks Wednesday April 20th.

strong trader finished stowing away the wood washed off, &c.

Middle part strong trader, lying at anchor.

Satter part fresh trader, at daylight took the anchor and stowed W. S. W. employed stowing the anchor, &c.

Satt 21.30 W.

Remarks Thursday April 21st.

Fresh trader steering W by S. finished oiling, and stowing away the cable, put the new boat out on the Starboard cranes and the old one on the beam, took in the Bow Boat to fix her up.

Middle part fresh trader, steering W by S.

Satter part fresh trader steering W by S, cleaned out the bow boat and painted the Starboard boat, opened a cask of Bread.

Light trader steering W by S, painted the bow boat inside and put her out on the cranes, at sunset set the royal.
