 Latter part A moderate gale from the S.W. with strong flow, and a rough sea.
 The wind veering Westward, heading from S.E. & to South, under close
 reefed main, topsail, & storm sails, thick weather, turned up the bow boat.

The gale moderating, and veering Westward, at 1 Pm set close reefed
 fore topsail, and foresail steering S.E. & S. made sail gradually, at 5 Pm
 steering S.E. & S. set all sail, considerable sea on, at sunset the wind N.W.

Latter part light breeze from the N.W. steering S.E. & S. & slackened the mast.

Remarks Tuesday June 14th.

Fresh trader steering S.E. & S. at 3.30 Pm, steering South, all sail set.

Middle part fresh trader, with gull, steering South.

Latter part fresh trader steering S.E. & S.

Satt 21.28 N. Long 156.23 W.

Remarks Wednesday June 15th.

Fresh trader steering S.E. & S. at 3.30 Pm saw Sam Morotoi & Mouree
 of Sandwich Island, ahead.

Middle part fresh trader steering Westward for the Island Oahu.

Latter part fresh trader at 8 Am the Captain went on shore at Honolulu Oahu.

Remarks Thursday June 16th.

Fresh trader the Ship standing off and on at the Island, at 1 Pm the
 foremast hand came aft to me with Gustavus Carter as spokesman
 and said that they wanted to see the American Consul before leaving here.
 at 3 Pm the boat came on board, received on board one bag of coffee,
 one box of Stout for medicine, and 2 boxes of soap.

Middle part fresh trader, Latter part the same.

Remarks Friday June 17th.

Fresh trader at 1 Pm sent a boat ashore, at 4.30 Pm the Captain came on
 board, and took his departure, steering Westward, bound back to the
 Britis Ocean, received on board 24 fowl, one bag of rice and a few other things.

Middle part light trader steering to the N.W.

Latter part fresh trader steering N.W. At 10 in sight, made new fore sheet.

Satt 22.50 N. Long 157.49 W.

Remarks Saturday June 18th.

Fresh trader steering N.W. & N. employed stowing the sail away.

Middle part fresh trader steering N.W. & N.

Latter part light trader steering N.W. & N. employed mending the Spanker.
