Remarks' Saturday July 2nd.

Light wind from the South, steering N.W., thick and dry foggy weather.

Middle part light breeze from the S.W. steering Westward, steering N.W.

Satter part light breeze from the Westward, heading N.W. fired a ball into a Jinkback, fog, but quite clear at interval.

Long 170.57 W.

Remarks' Sunday July 3rd.

Light air from the N.W. baffling, heading to the North, quite clear weather.

Middle part light baffling breeze from the N.W., heading North to N.E.

Satter part light baffling breeze from Westward, heading from North to N.W.

Remarks' Monday July 4th.

Light breeze from the Westward heading N.W.

Middle part fresh breeze from Westward, steering N.W. by N.E.

Satter part the same, opened a cask of Bread.

Remarks' Tuesday July 5th.

Fresh breeze from the Westward with fog & squalls, heading N.W. by N. thick at 6 Pm. Manuel Lisbon came ast in a disrespectful manner to the Captain about meat, and was very insolent, for which he was ordered to be put in iron. he drew a cut knife which he threatened to use in resistance for which he was knocked down, put him in iron, and put him in the Ship's room. Gustavus Foster was coming ast to his assistance with a billet of wood, likewise Antonio Miguel with a shovel & Manuel Lopez with a sharpn, all three particularly active in producing a mutiny, especially Gustavus Foster who called all hands to come on.

Middle part fresh breeze from the N.W. with fog steering N.W.

Satter part fresh breeze from the Westward baffling, heading N.W. & N.W. by N. saw several seal, some drift stuff, kelp, &c.

Satt 51.54 N. at noon. Long 171.34 W. at 9 Am.

Remarks' Wednesday July 6th.

Fresh breeze from the Westward, baffling Northward, heading N.W. to N.E. at 1 Pm saw the Island of Guam, one of the Fox Islands bearing N.W. by Compass, about 2.5 miles off.

Middle part light breeze from West, heading N.W. thick fog.

Satter part light air from West baffling to the N.W. heading N.W. to N.E. quite clear, saw grasshopper, at 10 Am fog.

Remarks' Thursday July 7th.

Light air from the N.E. heading to the N.W. at 2 Pm quite clear, at 3 Pm saw Land & high peak and another Island bearing to the E. S.E. by compass, at 4 Pm saw another Island with two high peaks on it, bearing to the S.E.

Middle part light air from Eastward steering N.W. by N.W.

Satter part light breeze from the E. S.E. steering N.W. and N.W. by N. the Islands in sight in the morning, saw a Jinkback, and a dead albatross.

Light breeze from the E. S.E. steering N.W. by N.W.

Middle part light breeze from the S.E. baffling, steering N.W. by N.W.

Satter part light breeze from the E. S.E. steering N.W. by N.W. saw several Jinkback, &c.

Long 172.24 W. 4 Am

Light breeze from the E. S.E. steering N.W. by N.W.

Middle part light baffling breeze from S.E. to East, steering N.W.

Satter part light breeze from the East, baffling, steering N.W. saw a Jinkback.

Light breeze from the East, baffling to the S.E. steering N.W.

Middle part light breeze from the S.E. steering N.W.

Satter part light breeze from the S.E. baffling, steering different courses, from N.W. to N.E. at 6.30 Am saw some ice, at 10 Am saw the Island of Matthews bearing to the North.

Remarks' Monday July 11th.

Light breeze from Eastward, baffling, steering N.W.

Middle part fresh breeze from the East, steering N.W.

Satter part fresh breeze from the East, baffling to the N.E. steering N.W. sent down fore royal yard & sail, started one ill of Bed & 2 ill of Deck.

Satt 62.58 N.

Long 173.31 W.

Remarks' Tuesday July 12th.

Fresh breeze from the East baffling, heading North to N.W. by N. put out the cutting stage.

Middle part fresh breeze from the N.E. baffling, heading N.W. to North.

saw the Land the Ship abreast of Clover Bay, at 3 Am.

Satter part strong breeze from the N.E. baffling, the Ship working to the N.E. along the Land, saw an hermaphrodite dog, supposed a trailer, saw 3 or 4 mud digger.
