Remark' Saturday September 17th.

Strong wind from the North, steering S. S. W. to S. W. all sail set. Thick, overcast, and damp weather. at 5 Pm saw St Lawrence Island bearing South, & sail in sight.

Middle part strong wind from the N. W. steering S. E. moderating.

Latter part light breeze from the N. W. steering S. E. one sail in sight.

Remark' Sunday September 18th.

Light breeze from the S. W. steering S. E. the wind veering Westward.

Middle part light breeze from Westward steering S. E.

Latter part fresh breeze from the N. W. baffling to the North, steering different courses, S. E. South & S. E. the wind increasing.

Remark' Monday September 19th.

Strong breeze from the North, steering S. E. & S. S. E. at 5.30 Pm saw the Island of Matthews lying to the S. W. at 1 Pm the Ship under close reefed fore & main topsail, steering S. E.

Middle part strong breeze from the North, baffling to the N. W. steering S. S. E.

at midnight steering S. S. E. the wind glauy & moderating.

Latter part light breeze from Westward, baffling Southward steering S. S. E. & S. E. saw several seals.

Remark' Tuesday September 20th.

Light baffling breeze, at 3 Pm fresh breeze from Eastward, baffling, with thick weather, fog & rain, heading Southward, furled mainsail and light sail.

Middle part light baffling breeze from Southward with calm.

Latter part the same, at 10 Pm showery, the Ship working Southward.

Remark' Wednesday September 21st.

Light baffling breeze, at 2 Pm light breeze from Westward steering S. S. E. at 4 Pm steering S. E. & S. had some light drizzling rain.

Middle part strong breeze from the N. W. steering S. E.

Latter part fresh breeze from the N. W. baffling Westward, steering S. E.

at 6 Pm saw the Island St Pauls. the Ship steering different courses, passed around East end of the Island, passed close to Walhouse Island, saw plenty seal and Walhouse on the Island and about it, had a few fog specks at 10 Pm heading to the S. W. two sail in sight and plenty of fur seal.

Remark' Thursday September 22nd.

Fresh breeze from the Westward, with fog equal, the Ship heading to the

North, and to the S. W. at noon spoke Bark Abigail of New Bedford Captain Sigsbee, 5 sail in sight 3 of them steering Southward, at sunset spoke Bark Ramehameha middle part light breeze from N. W. heading S. W. and North. Latter part light air baffling, heading Eastward the Ship, 3 or 4 miles from Otter Island, saw several jinkacks in towards St George's Island, saw plenty seal.

Remark' Friday September 23rd.

Light air from the Eastward, heading to the N. E. saw jinkacks the Ship, between St Pauls Island, and St George's. The Bark Abigail & Bark Ramehameha in sight.

Middle part light & fresh breeze from the S. E. baffling, heading S. E. at midnight were round and headed S. S. W. the wind glauy.

Latter part strong breeze from the S. E. heading S. W. E. thick weather & drizzling rain in a jinkack, one sail in sight the Ship, under double reefed topsail, fore & main & Spencer's.

Remark' Saturday September 24th.

Strong breeze from the S. E. with thick and wet weather, heading S. W. E. at 1 Pm spoke Bark Cicero of New Bedford, Capt' Stivers.

Middle part strong breeze from the S. E. steering S. E. W. thick fog weather.

Latter part strong breeze from the S. E. steering S. E. W. thick fog and wet weather, saw one sail off the quarter 3 or 4 miles off supposed the Bark Cicero.

Remark' Sunday September 25th.

Strong breeze from the S. S. E. with thick fog weather heading East, furled the foresail, and set the fore staysail.

Middle part light and fresh breeze from the S. E. baffling, steering S. E. W. fog, at midnight quite clear, at 3 Pm fog, the wind increasing.

Latter part strong breeze from S. E. at daylight were round and headed South, thick fog and rain, weather quite clear at intervals, saw Bark Cicero in the morning, at 1 Pm steering S. S. W. at noon close reefed the topsail.

Remark' Monday September 26th.

Strong wind from the East, steering S. S. W. at sunset the Ship under close reefed fore and main topsail and storm sail.

Middle part fresh & light breeze from the S. E. steering S. S. W. fog and wet weather.

Latter part light air and calm, with a heavy swell from the N. E. steering S. S. W. and S. W. fog weather quite clear at intervals, started 2 Bll of Pork, and one Bll of Beef. The Sun at noon Bath 55.55 N. Long 168.00 W. Saw a number of seals.
