

Remarks On Board Ship Janus Of New Bedford Mass.

Remarks Friday October 7th.

Strong wind from the S.W. steering E. by N. all sail set. The wind glass,

Middle part strong wind from the S.W. steering E. by N.

Latter part strong breeze in the morning the wind veered to S.E. the wind increasing to a gale. Took in sail gradually, at noon the ship under double reefed topsail & foresail, heading E. by E.

Remarks Saturday October 8th.

Strong gale from the S.E. with heavy flow of wind, the ship heading E. by E. under close reefed main topsail & storm sail. Towed up the bow and waist at 3.30 P.M. the sea main topsail sheet parted, clewed up the topsail and furled it, part the sea main left and the becket in the block stop of the other one. Sea clewline and buntline both parted, started considerable of the foot rope off of the sail &c.

Middle part strong gale from the S.E. with heavy gait of wind, heading E. by E. a heavy sea on, thick and rainy weather. Lost the bow boat after crane.

at midnight the wind veered to the S.W. gradually, headed S. by E.

Latter part moderating at 6 A.M. set close reefed fore topsail and foresail steering E. by N. a heavy sea running, repaired the main topsail &c. at noon sent down the mizzen topsail for repair, set fore & main topsail, and top gallant sail.

Remarks Sunday October 9th.

Strong breeze from the S.W. with a heavy sea running, steering E. by N. repaired the mizzen topsail and bent it, at 4 P.M. the ship under topsail, top gallant sail, and foresail.

Middle part light breeze from the South, steering E. by N.

Latter part light and fresh breeze from the S.E. heading E. by E. all sail set.

Salt 4.01 N.

Remarks Monday October 10th.

Fresh breeze from the S.E. heading E. by E. the breeze increasing, took in some of the light sail.

Middle part strong wind from the S.E. with flow, heading E. by N. W. double reefed the topsail, furled jib and mainsail, thick weather.

Latter part A moderate gale with flow from the S.E. heading E. by N. W. the wind backing to the Southward, furled the foresail, the ship under three close reefed topsail, and storm sail, thick weather and rainy, at noon the gale abated, heading East.

Remarks Tuesday October 11th.

Break and light haze from the Southward, with thick weather and drizzling rain, steering East, set the foresail, whole topsail, main top gallant sail, and repaired the jib. at 5 P.M. set all sail considerable swell on.

Middle part light air from Southward with calm, steering East.

Latter part light breeze from the South, steering East.

Remarks Wednesday October 12th.

Light breeze from the S.W. steering East, at 2.30 P.M. steering E. by E. at 6.30 P.M. the wind veered Westward in a squall, with a strong breeze and rain, at 7 P.M. fine weather.

Middle part fresh breeze from the W. by W. steering E. by E.

Latter part light breeze from the West, steering E. by E. fine weather broke out rather, started 2 M. of Pork, and 1 M. of Beef.

Remarks Thursday October 13th.

Light breeze from the West, steering E. by E. at 2.30 P.M. steering E. by E. the wind very light.

Middle part light breeze from the S.E. heading Eastward.

Latter part light breeze from the S.E. heading Eastward, the wind backing, the sail in sight.

Remarks Friday October 14th.

Light air from the Eastward backing the ship, working to the S.E. the two sail in sight.

Middle part light air backing from Eastward the ship, working to the S.E.

Latter part light breeze from the Eastward, backing, heading to the S.E. opened a cask of flour, and employed drying, and cleaning the bone.

Remarks Saturday October 15th.

Light breeze from the S.E. heading to the E. by E. finished cleaning the bone, & made 10 bundles of it.

Middle part light breeze from S.E. backing Eastward, heading E. by E. to East.

Latter part light breeze from S.E. backing, heading East and E. by S. saw a fin back.

Salt 44.14 N.

Remarks Sunday October 16th.

Light breeze from the South, backing, heading E. by S. and E. by E. the wind very light.

Middle part light air from the South, heading E. by E.

Latter part light air and calm, saw grass finches, saw 4 small sun fish.

Remarks Monday October 17th.

Light air from the N.E. steering E. by E. at sunset the breeze freshening.

Middle part light breeze from the N. by E. steering E. by E.

Latter part the same in the morning, at 9 A.M. nearly calm with light air from the N. by W. employed washing the ship inside with lye.
