

Remarks On Board Ship Janus of New Bedford, Mass.

Latter part fresh breeze, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty, at 10 Am the wind increased to a strong breeze.

Remarks Monday November 7th.

Strong Westerly wind, the Ship lying at anchor.

Middle part the same.

Latter part strong breeze from the NW, the watch all on board, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty, at 8 Am carpenter came on board.

Remarks Tuesday November 8th.

Strong breeze from the NW, employed in ship's duty.

Middle part strong breeze with squalls, the Ship lying at anchor, Latter part fresh breeze from the NW, the watch all on board, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty, the *Samara Bengal*, and Joseph Michael's a boatsteerer has been discharged here.

Remarks Wednesday November 9th.

Light breeze from the Westward, the Ship lying at anchor.

Middle part light breeze.

Latter part light air, the watch all on board, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty, at 2 Am the carpenter came on board.

Remarks Thursday November 10th.

Light breeze from Westward, Middle part the same.

Latter part light air from Southward, sent on board the Ship, *Prima Donna* of New York 10 bundles of Whalebone weighing 1132 lb, to be shipped to New Bedford marked **JANUS** with red paint on each side of the bundles, the watch all on board, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty.

Remarks Friday November 11th.

Light air from Southward baffling, the carpenter have finished their work.

Middle & Latter part light NW breeze, the watch all on board, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty.

Remarks Saturday November 12th.

Light breeze from the NW, employed in ship's duty.

Captain Joseph H. Cornell. A.D. 1864.

Middle part the same. Latter part light air from Southward with fog, delivered 3 coil of towline to Bark J. D. Thompson, the watch all on board, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty.

Remarks Sunday November 13th.

Strong breeze from Westward, received on board 2250 gallons fresh water.

Middle and Latter part light Westerly breeze, the watch all on board, the Starboard watch went ashore on liberty.

Remarks Monday November 14th.

Light Westerly breeze, Middle part the same with fog.

Latter part light air from Northward, the watch all on board, received on board a hind quarter of beef, 2 pieces corned beef, employed stowing away water, &c.

Remarks Tuesday November 15th.

Light breeze from Northward, received on board a few small stores, & a bag of chine Apples.

Middle part the same. Latter part light breeze from SE in the morning, at 2 Am strong breeze from the SE veering to the SW with rain.

Remarks Wednesday November 16th.

Fresh breeze from the Westward, at 3 Pm strong breeze from the North, received on board 20 sack Potatoes, 4 sack Onions, 3 sack Beans, delivered a hedge anchor to Bark *Gratistule*.

Middle part fresh and strong breeze from the Northward.

Latter part strong breeze from the North, received on board 10 sack Potatoes, 2 sack Turnips, 1 sack Beet, about 3 dozen Pumpkins, and several dozen cabbage, started 2 bbl of Pork, and 1 bbl of Beef.

Remarks Thursday November 17th.

Strong wind from the North, received on board 2 small bag of Rice, sent ashore 1 new cutting Gall, and 6 empty barrel.

Middle part strong wind from the North.

Latter part light breeze from the Southward, John Andrews deserted from the Ship while on duty, received on board two Portuguese named Antonio Sylvio, and John Frater, received on board a hind quarter of fresh beef and 27 lb corned beef.
