 Latter part light breeze from Southward baffling, heading S. W. to W. S. W. made a new fore topsail runner, at 11 Am raining.

Remarks' Thursday December 15th

Light breeze from the S. S. E. heading to the S. W. had some rain at 5 Pm
 Light breeze from E. S. E. heading South, one sail in sight, heading to the S. S. W.
 Middle part light baffling wind from the S. E. heading S. S. W. to S. W.
 Latter part fresh breeze from the S. S. E. heading to the S. W. at 5 Am the fore rope of the main topsail parted, and split the sail to the 2nd reefband, sent it down for repair!
 Lat 4.09 N. Long 106.53 W.

Remarks' Friday December 16th

Fresh breeze from S. S. E. heading to the S. W. finished the topsail, & bent it.
 Middle part fresh breeze from S. S. E. baffling South heading S. W. S. to S. W. S. W.
 Latter part light breeze from the S. S. E. heading to the S. W. and S. W. S. W.
 repaired the main royal, put up new fore royal rigging.
 Lat 3.16 N. Long 108.38 W.

Remarks' Saturday December 17th

Light breeze from the South heading S. W. S. W. sent down fore top gallant sail, repaired it and bent it again.
 Middle part light breeze from the S. S. E. heading to the S. W.
 Latter part fresh breeze from the S. S. E. baffling heading to the S. W.
 Lat 2.16 N. Long 110.34 W.

Remarks' Sunday December 18th

Fresh breeze from the S. S. E. heading to the S. W. met the oil.
 Middle part heading S. W. S. W. Latter part light breeze from the S. E. heading S. S. W. saw a jumper, two finbacks, and some porpoises.
 Lat 1.10 N. Long 112.13 W.

Remarks' Monday December 19th

Light breeze from the S. E. baffling Eastward, heading S. S. W. to South.
 Middle part light breeze from the S. E. heading S. S. W.
 Latter part light breeze from the S. E. heading S. S. W. employed overhauling lower blocks
 Lat 0.34 N. Long 112.56 W.

Remarks' Tuesday December 20th

Light breeze from the S. E. heading S. S. W. had 2 or 3 light squalls, one with light drizzling rain, saw a white water, also porpoises and a finback.

 Latter part fresh breeze from the S. E. heading S. S. W. made a new main top gallant runner, and shifted the fore and main top gallant sheets.

Light wind from the S. E. heading S. S. W. and S. W. set taut the fore top gallant, and flying jib stays.

Middle part light wind from the S. E. heading S. S. W.
 Latter part light and fresh breezes from Eastward, baffling, heading from S. S. E. to S. W. employed taring the jib and footropes. Saw finback.
 Lat 2.08 S. Long 114.09 W.

Remarks' Thursday December 22nd

Light breeze from the East, heading S. S. E. set taut the fore topmast and top gallant backstays.

Middle part light breeze from the E. S. E. heading S. S. E.
 Latter part fresh breeze from Eastward heading to the S. S. E.
 Lat 1.06 S. Long 114.22 W.

Remarks' Friday December 23rd

Light breeze from the E. S. E. heading S. S. E. saw porpoises & a finback.
 Middle part light breeze from the East, heading S. S. E. at midnight wore round and headed to the N. E.

Latter part fresh breeze from the East, heading N. E. S. W. at 6 Am wore round and headed S. S. E. employed overhauling blocks &c.

Remarks' Saturday December 24th

Fresh breeze from the S. E. heading S. S. W. the wind baffling and flung.
 Middle part fresh breeze from the S. E. heading S. S. W.
 Latter part fresh breeze from the S. E. heading S. S. W. the wind flung.
 Lat 7.12 S.

Remarks' Sunday December 25th

Fresh breeze from the S. E. heading S. S. W. the wind flung, met the oil.
 Middle & latter part fresh breeze from E. S. E. baffling, heading South to S. S. E.
 Lat 9.44 S. Long 115.58 W.

Remarks' Monday December 26th

Fresh breeze from E. S. E. baffling, heading S. S. E. to South. the wind flung.
 Middle part fresh breeze from E. S. E. heading South. Latter part the same.
 Lat 12.18 S. Long 116.34 W.
