Strong wind from the N.W. steering E.S. and S.E. all sail set. Thick & foggy weather.  
Middle and Latter part strong breeze from the N.W. steering E.S.E. Thick and rainy weather, started still buoy & still Port.

Remarks' Sunday January 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Strong breeze from the N.W. steering E.S.E. Thick and rainy weather.  
Middle part fresh breeze from West by N. steering E.S.E.  
Latter part light breeze from the S.W. by N. steering E.S.E. clear.  
Lat 52.40 S. Long 81.00 W.

Remarks' Monday January 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Fresh breeze from the West steering E.S.E.  
Middle part the same, saw a Comet bearing S.S.E. by N. by N.  
Latter part fresh breeze from N.W. steering E.S.E. saw several Jimback & porpoises.  
Lat 54.40 S. Long 77.54 W.

Remarks' Tuesday January 24<sup>th</sup>.

Fresh breeze from the N.W. steering E.S.E.  
Middle part strong wind from West steering E.S. had a few squalls  
taken in some sail at 8.30 P.M. saw a merchant bark standing to S.W.  
Latter part strong wind from the West by N. steering E.S.E.  
Lat 56.16 S. Long 73.28 W.

Remarks' Wednesday January 25<sup>th</sup>.

Strong wind from the N.W. with squall of light drizzling rain steering E.S. by N.  
Middle part A gale from the N.W. with squall steering  
steering E.S. by N. Gauled mainsail fore and main top gallant sail.  
Latter part strong gale from the N.W. with squall steering East,  
a heavy sea on the starboard clewing of the fore topsail parted in the  
weld, at noon double reefed fore & main top sail & stored N.E. Gauled main top sail.  
Lat 56.46 S. Long 67.38 W.

Remarks' Thursday January 26<sup>th</sup>.

Strong gale from the West with squall steering N.E. and N.E. by N.  
Middle part the same steering N.E. by N.  
Latter part the gale moderating steering N.N.E. one sail in sight,  
at 4 P.M. saw the *Santa Rosa del Euzo* bearing N.W. saw  
Station Land ahead, at 7 P.M. steering N.E. by N. with a strong  
breeze from the West set all sail during the forenoon.  
Lat 54.50 S. Long 62.36 W.

## Captain Joseph H. Cornell, A.D. 1865.

Remarks' Friday January 27<sup>th</sup>.

Fresh breeze from the West by N. steering N.E. by N. had a hail squall. spoke *Brake Wilhemina* of St John's N.B. head Westward.  
Middle part light breeze from the West steering N.E. by N. had a few squalls.  
Latter part strong breeze from the S.W. steering N.E. by N. one sail in sight.  
Lat 53.22 S. Long 60.01 W.

Remarks' Saturday January 28<sup>th</sup>.

Strong wind with squall from the S.W. steering N.E. by E. and N.E. at  
6.30 P.M. saw the *Island Beauchamp* bearing North passed it near enough to see *Beauchamp*  
Middle part strong wind with squall from S.W. steering N.E. by N.  
Latter part strong wind with squall from the S.W. steering N.W. at 5 A.M.  
saw East Falkland Island bearing N.W. passed around the East end steering  
North and N.E. by N. passed within 2 or 3 miles of the lighthouse at entrance of Port Stanley.  
Lat 51.04 S. Long 57.37 W.

Remarks' Sunday January 29<sup>th</sup>.

Slight breeze with hail squall from the S.W. steering N.W. by N. at 4 P.M. the  
breeze & squall with hail squall sometimes nearly calm, saw plenty Jimback.  
Middle part fresh breeze from the West steering N.E. by N.  
Latter part fresh breeze from the N.W. heading N.E. the wind increasing.  
Lat 48.46 S. Long 56.42 W.

Remarks' Monday January 30<sup>th</sup>.

Strong breeze from the N.W. steering N.W. at 5 P.M. had a squall from  
the N.W. with wind and some rain, double reefed the topsail & c.  
Middle part light breeze from the West steering N.W.  
Latter part light breeze from the N.W. heading North.  
Lat 47.06 S. Long 55.47 W.

Remarks' Tuesday January 31<sup>st</sup>.

Fresh breeze from the N.W. heading N.E. took in the light sail.  
Middle part strong wind with squall from the N.W. heading Northward.  
Latter part A moderate gale from the N.W. heading North to N.W. close  
reefed the topsail, and set the stunsail. saw grasshoppers.  
Lat 45.51 S. Long 53.46 W.

Remarks' Wednesday February 1<sup>st</sup>.

A moderate gale from the N.W. heading North, at sunset moder-  
ating, set double reefed fore and main topsail, and jib.  
Middle part strong breeze from the N.W. heading North.  
Latter part A moderate gale with squall from the N.W.
