

Remarks On Board Ship Janus of New Bedford, Mass.

At sunset double reefed the topsail &c. hauld aback the main topsail.
Middle part fresh breeze from E. N. E. heading to the S. E. with the main topsail aback.
Satter part strong wind from E. N. E. baffling, the wind increasing, at 6 Am were under
and headed to the North, at 10 Am thick & rainy, furl'd gill and mainsail.

Remarks Tuesday March 21st.

Strong wind from the N. E. with heavy rain heading to the North, took in sail.
At sunset the wind veered to the North, heading Westward, furl'd the foresail.
Middle part light wind veering Southward, the ship on starboard tack.
Satter part strong wind from the South heading S. E. & E. at 8 Am steering
N. E. the wind glazy, saw one sail, also saw grampuses.

Satt 32.08 S. Long 46.02 W.

Remarks Wednesday March 22nd.

Strong wind from the South, steering N. E. set all sail.
Middle part fresh breeze from the South, steering N. E. all sail set.
Satter part fresh breeze from S. S. E. with rain squall, steering N. E. mending the main topsail.
Satt 29.50 S. Long 43.38 W.

Remarks Thursday March 23rd.

Fresh breeze from S. S. E. with rain squall, steering N. E. and N. E. & E.
Middle part the same, steering N. E. & E. had plenty lightning &c.
Satter part strong breeze in the morning with glazy from S. E. baffling steering
N. E. & E. set top gallant sail during the forenoon, employed mending the topsail.
Satt 28.00 S. Long 41.24 W.

Remarks Friday March 24th.

Light breeze from the S. S. E. steering N. E. & E. & E. & E. all sail set.
Middle part light breeze from S. S. E. veering Southward, steering E. N. E.
Satter part light breeze from the S. W. steering E. N. E. to N. E. saw one sail heading
Southward, finished the main topsail and bent it again.

Satt 27.24 S. Long 39.49 W.

Remarks Saturday March 25th.

Light breeze from the S. W. steering N. E. one sail in sight, heading Southward.
Middle and Satter part the same, employed in ship duty.
Satt 26.00 S. Long 38.23 W.

Remarks Sunday March 26th.

Light air from Westward, steering N. E. met the oil, at sunset calm weather.
Middle part light baffling breeze from the N. E. heading Westward.
Satter part light wind from N. N. E. heading Eastward, all sail set.

Remarks Monday March 27th.

Light wind from the N. N. E. heading S. E. W. at 1 Pm saw
Speron Whaler two points of the weather bar going Southward, breaching and
spouting, leeward for them, at 3 Pm struck one and saved him, the other two
boat chased until sunset, at 7.30 Pm they came on board, thick & rainy weather.

Middle part strong breeze from N. N. E. with plenty rain.

Satter part strong baffling wind from the North, with plenty rain, at 9 Am it
cleared up some, the wind veering Westward, began to cut in the whale.

Satt 25.39 S. Long 37.31 W.

Remarks Tuesday March 28th.

Strong wind from the West and S. W. had a few rain squalls, finished cutting the whale
and bailed the case, at 4 Pm set double reefed topsail, were round and headed Southward.

Middle part strong wind from S. W. baffling heading South, at 1 Am began to boil.

Satter part strong wind from S. W. baffling to South, steering N. E. to E. N. E. employed bailing head.
Satt 25.03 S. Long 36.35 W.

Remarks Wednesday March 29th.

Fresh breeze from the South, steering E. N. E. to N. E. & E. bailing saw a white water.
Middle part fresh breeze with light drizzling rain squall, steering N. E. & E.
Satter part fresh breeze from the S. E. steering N. E. & E. N. E. bailing saw one sail.
Satt 22.55 S. Long 35.49 W.

Remarks Thursday March 30th.

Fresh breeze from the S. E. steering N. E. finished bailing, passed a black heading Southward.
Middle part strong breeze from the S. E. steering N. N. E.
Satter part strong wind and glazy from the S. E. steering N. N. E. and N. E. & E.
Satt 20.18 S. Long 35.00 W.

Remarks Friday March 31st.

Strong wind from the S. E. with squall, steering N. N. E. at 5 Pm rainy weather.
Middle part strong breeze from the S. E. steering N. N. E.
Satter part strong wind from the S. E. baffling, with squall of drizzling
rain, the wind moderating, set all sail steering N. N. E. and N. E. & E.
Satt

Remarks Saturday April 1st.

Light breeze from the E. S. E. steering N. N. E. at 2 Pm the wind baffling in a
squall with rain, at 3 Pm light breeze from the South, at sunset furl'd light sail &c.
Middle part the same. Satter part light breeze from
the E. S. E. baffling steering N. N. E. one brig in sight heading Southward.
Satt 16.26 S. Long 34.30 W.
