

Remarks On Board Ship James O. New Bedford Mass.

Remarks' Saturday April 29th.

Sight and fresh breeze from S.E., steering N.W.E. at 2 P.M. rainy weather, at 4 P.M. took in sail to a close reefed fore & main topsail, at sunset furled fore topsail, were round and headed S.W. strong wind.

Middle part the same. Latter part light breeze from the South steering North, put a stop on the leachrope of main topsail, & took the oil.

Satt 30.43 N. Long 51.32 W.

Remarks' Sunday April 30th.

Light breeze from the S.W. baffling, steering North, shortened sail.

Middle part light breeze from the S.W. heading Westward.

Latter part light air from Southward steering North, saw porpoise and a humpback.

Satt 32.19 N. Long 52.31 W.

Remarks' Monday May 1st.

Light air baffling with calm, heading Northward, at sunset shortened sail.

Middle part light air from the N.E. baffling, heading Northward.

Latter part light breeze from the S.W.E. heading to the S.E. broke out a fog & latter, put another goatscope on the fore top gallant sail, saw two finbacks.

Satt 32.36 N. Long 52.13 W.

Remarks' Tuesday May 2nd.

Fresh breeze from the East with 'blow', steering different courses, saw a jumper.

Middle part fresh breeze from the East, heading to the S.E.

Latter part strong breeze from the East, baffling, heading to the S.E. under whole topsail.

Satt 31.40 N. Long 50.48 W.

Remarks' Wednesday May 3rd.

Fresh breeze from the East baffling, heading to the S.E. one sail in sight.

at 4 P.M. spoke Barf George of New Bedford Captain Stanton 10 miles

15 a 600 spm oil. Middle part the same heading Northward.

Latter part light breeze from the East, at 5 P.M. tacked and headed

N.W.E. employed sitting, took the topmast rigging, saw one sail.

Sight breeze from the East, heading N.W.E. two sail in sight.

Middle part light breeze from the East baffling heading N.E.

fore & main top gallant sheets, two merchant vessel in sight, heading to E.N.E.

Remarks' Friday May 5th.

Fresh breeze from the S.E. heading E.N.E. at sunset shortened sail.

Middle part strong breeze from the S.E. heading Eastward.

Latter part strong wind from the S.E. heading East at noon

hoisted the pig, the ship under double reefed topsail, foresail, &c.

Satt 34.07 N. Long 48.30 W.

Remarks' Saturday May 6th.

Strong wind and a roused sea from the S.E. heading E.S.E.

Middle part strong breeze from the S.E. heading E.S.E.

Latter part A moderate gale from the South, heading to the S.E.

Satt 34.30 N. Long 47.12 W.

Remarks' Sunday May 7th.

A moderate gale from the South, baffling Westward moderating

heading to the S.E. at 4 P.M. steering East, at sunset steering E.S.E.

Middle part strong breeze from the West, steering E.S.E.

Latter part fresh breeze from the N.W. steering E.S.E. saw a humpback, &c.

Satt 35.18 N. Long 45.21 W.

Remarks' Monday May 8th.

Fresh breeze from the West, steering E.S.E. Middle part the same.

rainy weather. Latter part strong breeze from the West with

drizzling rain squall, passed through a lot of drift plank, set fast the

forestay, at noon saw a wrecked vessel loaded with lumber full of water

boarded her and got a few chains, blocks, &c. her rigging was wire, her

fore, and mainmast, topmast, top gallant mast, were standing with the

three yard' crossed at the main the sail having been taken off, and the fore

top gallant yard up forward, the foreyard lying across the bow, she

was abandoned, and had been set fire to aft, the mizzen mast was gone, &c.

Remarks' Tuesday May 9th.

Fresh breeze from the West steering East, at 3 P.M. the boat came on board.

Middle part the wind veering Northward, steering East, had some rain.

Latter part fresh breeze from the North, steering Eastward took out the

starboard pump, and cleared out the dirt, chips, &c. in the well room.

Remarks' Wednesday May 10th.

Fresh breeze from the North, steering East & E.N.E. A merchant ship

in sight steering Eastward. at sunset close reefed the topsail.
