

Remarks On Board Ship *Gannet* of New Bedford, Mass.

Middle part fresh breeze from the North, heading S. N. E.
 Latter part fresh breeze from the N. W. heading to the N. E. saw finback?
 Batt 37.16 N. Long 39.06 W.

Remarks' Thursday May 11th.

Strong breeze from the N. W. heading to the N. E. sent down the old fore topsail, and bent the best one, at sunset the ship under storm sail.

Middle part the same. Latter part strong wind from the N. W. veering to the N. E. heading from N. E. to E. S. E. the wind moderated with thick weather, saw a Merchant ship heading to the N. W.

Remarks' Friday May 12th.

Slight breeze from the N. E. heading E. S. E. & E. S. E. under short sail.

Middle part light breeze from the N. E. veering to the S. E.
 Latter part fresh breeze from the S. E. steering North & N. W. rose new long yards and hauled tant the fore rigging, saw a humpback, and two sail.

Remarks' Saturday May 13th.

Fresh breeze from the S. E. steering N. W. rose new long yards and hauled tant the Port main rigging, also set tant the fore stay, saw a few finback, at sunset close reefed the topsail.

Middle part strong breeze from the S. E. laying with main topsail aback heading to N. E.

Latter part strong breeze from the E. S. E. steering N. W.

Remarks' Sunday May 14th.

Fresh breeze from the E. S. E. steering N. W. wet the oil, at sunset close reefed the topsail. Middle part light breeze from the E. S. E. heading N. E.

Latter part light air from the S. E. with calm, one sail in sight, saw Black fish. Sounded one boat without success, at 10 Am boarded the bark J. Cummings of Londonderry Nova Scotia, 37 days from Seeghorn, bound to New York.

Remarks' Monday May 15th.

Slight air from Southward baffling with calm, steering N. E. reefed the topsail. Middle part light air veering Westward, heading Northward.

Latter part light breeze from Westward steering N. E. saw a brig steering Eastward.

Remarks' Tuesday May 16th.

Fresh breeze from the N. W. steering N. E. at 4 Pm saw a gam of sperm whales, going to the Southward, lowered for them and succeeded in capturing three, at dark had them alongside. Middle part strong breeze from Westward.

Latter part strong breeze from the Westward employed cutting the whales, at 11 Am had the head cut off and body hove in of one whale, the piece tore out, &c. one of the other whales went around the bow, and parted the fluke chain, hove an iron into his small, and held the whale until we got a rope fast to him. we let the whale lay out of the larboard quarter.

Remarks' Wednesday May 17th.

Strong breeze the wind veered to the Northward, at 4 Pm had the head cut off and body hove in of another whale, parted the fluke chain &c. while cutting this whale, having ruzzed weather &c.

Middle part light breeze from the North, clearing up the deck, &c. Latter part light air, cut in the two head, bailed the case, & got them overboard.

Remarks' Thursday May 18th.

Slight breeze from the S. W. cut in the other whale, at sunset his case was bailed & overboard. Middle part fresh breeze from Westward, employed boiling body.

Latter part strong breeze from Westward, heading North & N. W. boiling.

Remarks' Friday May 19th.

Strong wind from the West heading N. W. breeze weather, boiling, opened a cask of flour, started two barrel of Pork and one barrel of Beef.

Middle part strong wind from West, employed boiling. Latter part A moderate gale from the S. W. heading to the N. W. ruzzed weather, and smoky, took in main topsail and foresail.

Remarks' Saturday May 20th.

A moderate gale the wind veered to the North, with fog squalls, employed boiling, the ship heading Eastward, saw a Merchant bark, heading Eastward. Middle part the wind moderating heading Eastward boiling.

Latter part strong wind from the North, with squall and glow of rain, some rain & hail, employed boiling, hauled, cutting up junk, &c.

Remarks' Sunday May 21st.

Strong breeze with glow from North, moderating heading Eastward, a heavy swell running, cutting up junk & boiling. Middle & Latter part light breeze from the North, heading East, boiling, a heavy swell running.
