

Remarks On Board Ship James G. New Bedford Mass.

Remarks Monday May 22nd.

Strong wind from the Westward heading to the North, boiling the case &c.
 Middle part A gale from the West heading N.W.W. boiling.
 Latter part A gale from the West heading N.W.W. finished boiling, and put on two feet of salted, employed clearing up the deck, lashing oil, &c.

Remarks Tuesday May 23rd.

Strong gale from the West heading N.W.W. put the salted all into the tank.
 Middle part strong gale from the West veering Northward.
 Latter part strong gale from the West veering to N.W.W. at 6.30 Am were round & headed Westward, employed boiling salted, and doing other small jobs.

Remarks Wednesday May 24th.

A gale of wind from the N.W.W. heading Westward, saw one sail bound Eastward.
 Middle part the gale moderating, heading Westward.
 Latter part strong wind from the N.W.W. heading Westward, employed boiling salted & set some sail, the foretop to the fore parted and split the sail, unbuttoned it, and bent the other fore.

Satt 41.14 N. Long 37.12 W.

Remarks Thursday May 25th.

Strong wind from the N.W. heading Westward employed boiling salted, cooping & lashing the oil, the wind increasing, the ship under storm sail.
 Middle part A gale from the N.W. heading W.S.W.
 Latter part the same, employed clearing up about the trywork, &c.

Satt 40.30 N. Long 37.12 W.

Remarks Friday May 26th.

A gale of wind from the N.W. heading to the W.S.W. Middle part the gale moderating heading to the S.W. Latter part strong breeze from N.W.W. heading S.W. with fog & squall and some light drizzling rain, employed breaking out at the forepeak, on the port side to stow oil.

Remarks Saturday May 27th.

Fresh breeze from Westward, heading to the S.W. employed stowing down oil.
 Middle part strong wind it veered to the Southward the ship on the Starboard tack had considerable rain. Latter part A moderate gale from the South, at 4.30 Am were round and headed Westward, the wind baffling with thick rainy weather, saw a merchant Bark pass close to us, heading Eastward, at 11 Am A moderate gale from the East, steering W.S.W. under storm sail having ragged weather and no opportunity to finish stowing the oil.

Remarks Sunday May 28th.

A moderate gale from the East the wind veering to the N.E. steering W.S.W. at 6 Am hauled by the wind heading N.W.W. Middle part moderating, Latter part light air & fresh breeze from the N.E. with rain, steering West, employed stowing down the oil, saw an Horn Breeze heading Eastward.

Satt 38.03 N.

Long 38.20 W.

Remarks Monday May 29th.

Strong wind from the N.E. steering Westward, employed stowing the oil, saw a sail heading Eastward, saw a shipback, at sunset heading to the N.W. Middle part strong wind from the N.E. heading to the N.W. Latter part strong wind from the North, with fog & squall, heading W.S.W. set some sail.

Satt 38.40 N.

Long 39.19 W.

Remarks Tuesday May 30th.

Strong wind from the North heading N.W.W. saw two sails heading Eastward.
 Middle part fresh breeze from the North heading N.W.W.
 Latter part fresh breeze from the N.W.E. heading to the N.W. finished stowing the oil, stowed down by the guage on the cask about 193 bbls of sperm oil.

Satt 38.38 N.

Long 40.44 W.

Remarks Wednesday May 31st.

Light breeze from the North, heading N.W.W. cleared up the deck and washed off, saw shipback, at sunset were round and headed to the E.N.E. Middle part light breeze from the North, veering Westward.
 Latter part fresh breeze from the West steering N.W. all sail set, took in the cutting stays and stiffened the fore & aft piece, saw shipback.

Satt 39.32 N.

Long 41.05 W.

Remarks Thursday June 1st.

Fresh breeze from the West, steering N.W.E. saw shipback, at 4 Pm put the cutting stay out, & close reefed the topsail, &c. at sunset the ship under storm sail, thick weather.
 Middle part strong breeze from the West, heading N.W.W.
 Latter part fresh breeze from West, steering East, thick & smoky weather, saw shipback.

Satt 40.12 N.

Long 40.30 W.

Remarks Friday June 2nd.

Light breeze from West, steering East, smoky weather, saw several shipbacks, at sunset hauled by the wind heading Southward, the ship under storm sail.
 Middle part light wind from W.S.W. heading South. Latter part strong breeze from W.S.W. steering N.W.E. saw shipback, smoky weather.
