

# Remarks On Board Ship James Of New Bedford, Mass.

Remarks Saturday June 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Strong wind from N.W. heading South. saw Jimback's bay by a floating & sunset shortened sail. Middle part fresh breeze heading South. The wind moderating. Latter part light baffling air and calm. The ship heading Southward. at 9 Am light breeze from the South steering E. N.E. started 2 W. Park, 1 W. Reef. saw Jimback's, Black Jack, killer, porpoise, and a piece of squid. had a few showers.

Remarks Sunday June 4<sup>th</sup>.

Fresh breeze from the South veering Westward steering E. N.E. and East, met the oil. The wind increasing, took in some sail. had a few showers of light rain. Middle part fresh breeze from Westward, heading Northward. Latter part light air from Westward, nearly calm, steering N.E. one sail in sight, sunset. Lat 41.33 N.

Remarks Monday June 5<sup>th</sup>.

Light breeze from the Northward, heading Eastward, had some rain. at 5 P. the Captain boarded the Bark Sarah of New Bedford, Captain Baker. 34 day's out clean, shortened sail, coming with the Bark Sarah. Middle part fresh breeze from the N.E. heading Eastward. Latter part fresh breeze from the N.E. heading Eastward, saw a Jimback & grampus. Remarks Tuesday June 6<sup>th</sup>.

Light breeze from the N.E. heading Eastward, coming with the Bark Sarah. Middle part light breeze the wind veered to S.W. steering N.W. Latter part strong wind from the S.W. steering N.E. & N. saw Jimback's & two sail. thick rainy weather, at noon furl'd fore topsail, & hauled by the wind, heading Westward.

Remarks Wednesday June 7<sup>th</sup>.

Strong wind from S.W. moderating, thick rainy weather, heading Westward. the wind veered to N.W. heading to the N.E. the weather quite clear. Middle part light wind from the N.W. heading Northward. Latter part light breeze from the S.E. baffling, heading E. S.E. saw a merchant Bark, steering Westward, had some drizzling rain, saw Jimback's. Lat 43.04 N.

Remarks Thursday June 8<sup>th</sup>.

Light wind from the N.W. the ship working to the N.E. one sail in sight. at 6 P. boarded the Bark George of New Bedford, Capt. Stanton 11 months out on W. sperm oil, saw a merchant ship, steering Westward, saw Jimback's. at sunset shortened sail. Middle part strong breeze from the N.E. heading Northward, had some rain. Latter part strong wind from the S.E. steering N.W. had some rain in the morning, saw several Jimback's. Lat 43.56 N. Long 38.11 W.

# Captain Joseph H. Cornell, A.D. 1865.

Remarks Friday June 9<sup>th</sup>.

Strong breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. saw a merchant Bark heading Southward, under short sail, at sunset shortened sail, and hauled by the wind heading Eastward. Middle part fresh breeze from the S.E. heading Eastward. Latter part light wind from the S.E. heading Eastward. the wind baffling. Lat 44.36 N. Long 35.08 W.

Remarks Saturday June 10<sup>th</sup>.

Light wind from Southward, heading to the S.W. saw a sail heading Eastward. Middle part light breeze from the South, heading to the S.W. nearly calm. Latter part light air from the S.E. baffling, with calm heading Southward, met the oil. Lat 44.26 N. Long 35.49 W.

Remarks Sunday June 11<sup>th</sup>.

Light air from Eastward baffling with calm, heading to the S.E. shortened sail. Middle part light breeze from E. N.E. with fog & squalls, heading to the S.E. Latter part the same, one sail in sight. the Bark Sarah Capt. Baker.

Remarks Monday June 12<sup>th</sup>.

Light breeze from the E. N.E. heading to the S.E. thick & foggy, coming with Bark Sarah, saw several Jimback's and grampuses, shortened sail. Middle part light air from the S.W. heading Southward. Latter part light breeze from the S.W. veering Westward, steering E. S.E. three sail in sight, saw Jimback's and humpback's. finished repairing the oil. Lat 45.58 N. Long 34.19 W.

Remarks Tuesday June 13<sup>th</sup>.

Light air from the N.W. steering E. S.E. saw humpback's going quick called them sperm whales, lowered without success, boarded a Dutch Merchant Bark 38 day's from Matanzas, bound to Hamburg, loaded with logwood, shortened sail. Middle part light air veering South, steering E. S.E. Latter part light breeze from the South steering Eastward, 3 sail in sight one a whaler heading Eastward, sent the main sail for repair. Lat 43.58 N. Long 33.27 W.

Remarks Wednesday June 14<sup>th</sup>.

Light breeze from the South, steering E. S.E. to S.E. saw Jimback's also 3 sail, employed repairing the mainsail, at sunset shortened sail. Middle part light breeze from the South, heading S.E. & E. Latter part fresh breeze from the South, heading S.W. & W. employed repairing the mainsail, saw several sail, one a whaler, a Bark with a new spanker. Lat 43.40 N. Long 33.25 W.
