

Remarks On Board Ship James G. New Bedford Mass.

Remark' Thursday June 15th.

Sight breeze from the South heading S.W. finished the mainmast & bent it.
Middle part wind the same with fog heading to the S.W.
Satter part light baffling breeze from Westward veering Southward with fog it cleared up in the morning, at 7 Am thick fog, at 8 Am the fog cleared off. The Ship heading from S. S.W. to S.E. Two merchantmen in sight, grampuses, porpoises, & broke out Butter, cheese, and killed one barrel with Shark.
Satt 43.20 N. Long 33.31 W.

Remark' Friday June 16th.

Sight breeze from the S.W. heading to the S.E. at sunset shortened sail.
Middle part the same with fog and rain.
Satter part the same thick fog, at 9.30 Am quite clear, saw grampuses,
Satt 43.13 N. Long 32.41 W.

Remark' Saturday June 17th.

Sight breeze from the South, heading Westward, saw Blackfish lowered for them and caught two, at sunset shortened sail, thick foggy weather.
Middle part light breeze from the South with fog & rain, heading to the S.W.
Satter part fresh breeze from the South, heading to the S.W. wet the oil, employed cleaning and mending the Blackfish blubber at 11.30 Am the wind veered to the Westward with rain and thick weather. The Ship steering South.

Remark' Sunday June 18th.

Fresh breeze from Westward, with thick and rainy weather, steering South.
Middle part light breeze from Westward, baffling, steering South.
Satter part light baffling breeze from West to S.W. heading South to S.E. saw a sail.
Satt 42.30 N. Long 32.24 W.

Remark' Monday June 19th.

Sight breeze from the S.W. heading S.E. at sunset fished fore & main S.E. sail.
Middle part light air from S.W. heading to the S.E.
Satter part light breeze freshening from the S.W. heading to the S.E. at 10.30 Am tacked and headed West, employed boiling the Blackfish the two fish have made three barrel of oil, saw a white whale and one sail, supposed to be a whaler heading N.W.W. saw Jimback.
Satt 42.04 N. Long 31.30 W.

Remark' Tuesday June 20th.

Fresh breeze from the South, baffling heading N.W. saw two sail merchantmen steering S.E. saw Jimback. Middle part strong fresh and light breeze from the South, with some rain. The wind

veered to the S.W. were round and headed to S.E. took in some sail.

Satter part fresh breeze from the S.W. baffling, heading S.E. to S.E.
Satt 41.33 N. Long 31.20 W.

Remark' Wednesday June 21st.

Fresh and strong breeze from S.W. heading West at 3 Pm took in light sail at 4.30 Pm close reefed the topsail, at sunset fished the mainmast.

Middle part strong breeze from S.W. heading Westward, somewhat squally.
Satter part fresh and strong breeze from S.W. baffling, heading S.E. to S.E. three sail in sight one a brig steering to the N.E. under short sail, one a double topsail bark working Southward, under short sail, the other heading Westward.
Satt 41.28 N. Long 31.35 W.

Remark' Thursday June 22nd.

Strong and fresh breeze from the S.W. baffling heading to the S.E. at 1 Pm were round and headed Westward, took in light sail, saw Blackfish.

Middle part fresh breeze veering Southward, heading from West to S.W. Satter part fresh breeze from the S.E. heading to the S.W. saw several merchantmen bound Eastward, one heading to the S.W. the bark we saw yesterday.
Satt 40.48 N. Long 32.46 W.

Remark' Friday June 23rd.

Sight breeze from S.E. veering Eastward, heading S.W. to S.W.
Middle part light breeze from the S.E. heading S.W.
Satter part fresh breeze with squall from the S.E. heading S.W. to S.W. several merchantmen in sight, at 6.30 Am tacked and headed to the S.E. saw land.
Satt 40.08 N. Long 32.10 W.

Remark' Saturday June 24th.

Sight breeze from the S.E. baffling heading South & S.W. at 5 Pm had a squall with wind and rain, took in light sail, at 6 Pm it cleared off, saw the Island, Corvo, and Flores, bearing South distance about 20 miles.

Middle part light breeze from S.E. the Ship, laying off the passage between Flores and Corvo. Satter part fresh breeze from S.E. at daylight saw a sperm whale going to windward toward the Island Corvo, there was several of them scattered about covered for them and caught one, took the whale alongside, while rearing the cutting gear saw them again lowered but lost the ring of them in a squall, had a few squall, with considerable rain, saw several vessel one a whaler, trailing,
