

Remarks On Board Ship *Janus* Of New Bedford Mass.Remarks Sunday June 25th.

Slight breeze from the S.W. had some rain the Island in sight.
 A dusk finished cutting the whale. Middle part fresh breeze from
 S.W. heading Westward, cleared away the case &c.
 Latter part fresh breeze from S.W. baffling to S.W. heading Westward
 at noon were round and headed to S.E. one sail in sight cutting a whale.

Remarks Monday June 26th.

Fresh breeze from the S.W. baffling Westward heading Southward.
 Middle part fresh breeze from W.S.W. heading S.W. boiling head.
 Latter part light breeze from the Westward, cruising about Corvo, and Flores,
 at 6 Am spoke Bark *Midus* of New Bedford, Captain Howland,
 49 months out 560 bl' sperm oil & 10 bl' whale oil, boiling, saw
 several merchantmen bound Eastward, saw grampuses the Ship
 close to the Island. Three Whaling vessel in sight.

Remarks Tuesday June 27th.

Slight breeze from the West, cruising about the Island, boiling.
 Middle part the same.
 Latter part light breeze from the W.W. heading to the S.W. boiling,
 several sail and the Island in sight, saw Finback.

Remarks Wednesday June 28th.

Slight breeze from the N.W. heading to the S.W. spoke the Bark
Callao of New Bedford, Captain Howland 34 months out with
 800 bl' sperm oil, 1000 bl' whale oil, finished boiling.
 Middle part light breeze the Ship working to the S.W.
 Latter part light baffling breeze from N.W. to N.E. the Ship cruising
 to Westward of the Island. Two whales in sight, *Midus* & *Callao*.

Remarks Thursday June 29th.

Slight air baffling from Northward, the Ship heading to the N.W.
 Middle part the same.
 Latter part light air with calm, employed stowing down the
 oil, the Island a short distance off, the Ship working
 toward the Island. The two whales in sight.

Remarks Friday June 30th.

Slight air and calm, the Ship drifting Eastward, finished stowing
 down the oil, stowed down by guage on the cask about 75 bl' sperm oil.
 Middle part light air and calm, the Ship working toward Flores
 Latter part light baffling breeze from Westward the Ship working toward
 Santa Cruz, Flores, at 8 Am the captain started for Santa Cruz
 with a boat for recruit &c, the Ship standing off and on at the Island.

Remarks Saturday July 1st.

Slight baffling breeze from Westward, the Ship standing off and on
 at Santa Cruz, at sunset the boat came on board with a Steiger
 3 hog, one sack of Potatoes, a basket of Onions, a few Eggs, &c.
 Middle part light breeze from the S.W. standing off and on at the Island.
 Latter part light breeze from Westward, baffling with glass, at 7 Am the Captain
 went ashore, the Ship standing off and on at the Island, Joseph Thomas
 has been discharged to day, sick, Joseph Mc. Sur is supposed has deserted.

Remarks Sunday July 2nd.

Fresh breeze with glass from Westward, the wind baffling, received on
 board one bullock, 6 Pig, 32 sack Potatoes, about 13 sack Onions,
 a few cabbage, Eggs, &c. sent ashore 3 barrel of dark whale oil,
 containing 90 gallon by three guage, and 3 barrel of Blackfish oil
 containing 92 gallon by three guage, Middle part strong wind from
 the Westward with squall and rain heading S.W. & S.E. Latter part the same.

Remarks Monday July 3rd.

Strong wind from Westward, heading Northward, thick & smoky weather,
 at sunset the Ship laying aback, abreast of Santa Cruz, Flores
 the Schooner *Francis* baffling of Aduliron, in sight, Middle part
 strong wind with strong glass from Westward,
 Latter part the same, the wind baffling, at 9 Am the captain went ashore.

Remarks Tuesday July 4th.

Fresh breeze from the Westward, with glass, the Ship standing
 off and on at Santa Cruz, Flores, at 6 Pm calm, the Ship about
 2 miles off from the town, at sunset strong breeze with squall, the
 Ship laying with the main topsail aback, waiting for the captain.
 Middle part strong breeze with glass, at 9 Pm the captain
