

Remarks On Board Ship Janus of New Bedford, Mass.

saw Sperm Whales scattered about from the weather beam, ahead and off the lee bow. The ship passed through the middle of them. The whales passed close to the ship, covered for them and succeeded in capturing one, at noon had the whale alongside ship Janus, the other two boats still in chase of the whale.

Remarks Sunday July 16th.

Light breeze from the NE, at 3 Pm the boat came on board, cut the whale's head off, took the jaw in, and lashed down for the night. Fine weather, saw one merchantman. Middle part light breeze heading to the SE. Satter part light air and calm, finished cutting, bailed the case, &c. saw a merchant bark, steering to the NW.

Remarks Monday July 17th.

Calm weather, employed boiling, cast & dunk, saw grampuses. Middle part light air & calm heading Southward, boiling. Satter part calm weather, boiling the head, saw porpoises &c.

Satt 36.07 N. Long 42.31 W.

Remarks Tuesday July 18th.

Calm weather, finished boiling the head. Middle part light air from Southward, heading to the SW. Satter part light air from the NW, with calm, heading to the NE, saw porpoises, two merchantmen in sight, steering to the NE.

Remarks Wednesday July 19th.

Light air from the Eastward, baffling, heading to the SE, boiling at dark finished boiling, spoke an English bark, a iron vessel. Middle part light breeze from S.W.E. heading to the SE. Satter part wind the same, steering to NW, saw several merchantmen heading N.

Satt 36.27 N. Long 42.44 W.

Remarks Thursday July 20th.

Light breeze from Eastward, steering to NW, at sunset was round & headed South. Middle part light breeze from Eastward heading Southward. Satter part light air from Eastward in the morning baffling to SE, heading NE to East, at 9 Am nearly calm, finished boiling fat lean. finished repairing the shrimp fish, and bent it again.

Remarks Friday July 21st.

Calm weather, at 6 Am light air from S.W.E. heading SE, sail in sight. Middle & Satter part the wind veered South & Westward, heading SE & steering down the oil. saw several merchantmen bound Eastward. Satt 36.33 N. Long 42.46 W.
Saturday July 22nd. Light breeze from Westward, steering E.S.E. & S.E. finished steering, stowed down the case on the deck, 9 o'clock from oil, about 2 o'clock left. Middle part heading S.W. Satter part light breeze from West, steering E.S.E. saw several merchantmen bound Eastward, at 6 Am boarded American bark Volunteer of Boston bound to Boston. Capt. Bertram and 1st Officer W. Sisson coming from New Bedford. Satt 36.05 N. Long 42.3 W.
Sunday July 23rd. Light breeze from West, steering E.S.E. Middle and Satter part light and fresh breeze from S.W. heading to the NW. Satt 36.12 N. Long 42.50 W.
Monday July 24th. Light and fresh breeze from the SW, steering NW & N. and headed S.E. at 6 Am steering N.W.E. Satt 37.05 N. Long 42.19 W.
Tuesday July 25th. Fresh and strong breeze from the SW, steering N.W. saw porpoises &c. turned up fore & aft, all at back stay, saw a schooner, going Westward, suffered a whale, wreck, and heavy weather, saw grampuses & a piece of squid. Satt 38.10 N. Long 42.26 W.
Wednesday July 26th. Strong and fresh breeze from the SW, steering N.W. & N.E. heading to the SE. Satter part steering N.E. Satt 40.00 N. Long 41.45 W.
Thursday July 27th. Light and fresh breeze from SW to SE, steering N.E. & S. heading E.S.E. Satter part heading E.N.E. saw black fish. Satt 40.4 N. Long 40.21 W.
Friday July 28th. Fresh and strong breeze from SE, heading E.N.E. & N.E. heading S.E. & N.E. saw grampuses & porpoises, Satter part heading Satt 40.25 N. Long 40.16 W.
Saturday July 29th. Strong, fresh & light breeze from SE, heading E.S.W. had a few rain squalls. at 5 o'clock spoke Ann Mahony brig, Julia of Fard with 30000 from London. four boiler, M. P. heading S.W. & steering Westward. Satt 39.30 N. Long 41.17 W.
Remarks Sunday July 30th. Light breeze from SE to South, steering West to N.W. saw three sail, one bound Westward. Satt 39.20 N. Long 42.59 W.
Monday July 31st. Light breeze from S.W. steering Westward. Middle & Satter part fresh & strong breeze from the South by West, with squall, heading W.S.W. spoke in the morning, saw a fish back.
Tuesday August 1st. Fresh & strong breeze from South by West to SE, somewhat squally, heading to SW. saw one sail, at sunset the ship under storm sail, had some rain squalls, & at the same, S. P. wind (S.E. heading S.W. close up to sail, &c. Satt 39.40 N. Long 42.37 W.
Wednesday August 2nd. Strong wind from the SE, heading to S.W. squally with some rain. Thursday August 3rd. Strong breeze from SE, heading S.W. squally. Middle part the wind veered to South, heading to S.W. Satter part light breeze from South heading E.S.E. at 10 Am gaining with bark Sarah, Capt. Fisher, another whale in sight. Satt 39.12 N. Long 42.36 W.
Friday August 4th. Light breeze from South heading E.S.E. at sunset spoke the bark President of N.B. Capt. Fetter, 24 day's out clear. M. S. light breeze from South with some squall, heading S.E. & S. light breeze W.S.W. steering E.S. saw black fish &c. some turtle & three sail. employed in putting new rigging to the Satter part. Satt 39.15 N. Long 42.35 W.
Saturday August 5th. Light breeze from West steering E.S.E. (S. steering South & S.W.) light breeze from NW, steering E.N.E. washed the ship outside. Satt 39.40 N. Long 41.33 W. black fish.
Sunday August 6th. Light breeze, the wind veered to NE heading Eastward. Middle part the same. Satter part light air from NW, with calm, steering NE & N.E. Satt 39.42 N. Long 41.10 W. saw one. Monday August 7th. Light air from the West, steering NE. Middle & Satter part the same. employed painting the ship outside. Satt 39.24 N. Long 40.08 W.
Tuesday August 8th. Light breeze from West, steering NE. (M.D. wind West heading N.W. & N.) light breeze from West steering Northward, saw two sail, at 7 Am boarded bark Chilna of New Bedford, Capt. Gilford, 3 months out clear. Satt 39.22 N. Long 41.08 W.
Wednesday August 9th. Fresh & light breeze from West heading Northward. (S.D. light breeze West steering East, cleaned out between decks, painted bowsprit and foremast, one merchantman in sight. Satt 39.53 N. Long 41.21 W.
